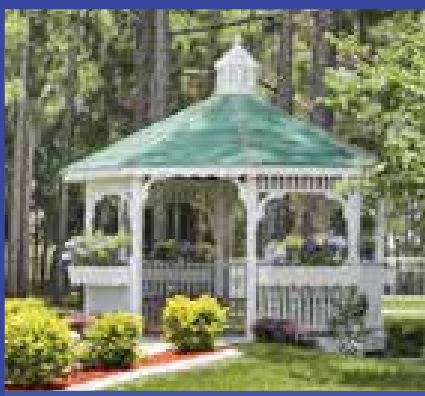

Bess says. But our hard-working Park staff fills in the time completing the list of projects which Park Manager Tess Schofield has for them.

“Summer-time and the livin’ is easy” – or so the song from Porgy and Joe and Bernie have been busy preparing the Phase 2 building for its’ stone facing. Painting was completed in June, and now they’re relocating some exterior electrical work which



was hidden under the mansard roof. Contractors relocated many of the air conditioner compressors closer to the building. Next they will be wiring for soffit lighting around the building under the eaves, installing the lighting and the soffit material. After stonework, gutters and landscaping, we'll be ready for a grand opening sometime in mid-August.

In the meantime, Johnny and some of our summer casual labor have been trimming trees and replacing dead and unsightly plants. Trimming shrubbery is a full-time job in the summer when all our local plants take to the wet, hot tropical conditions and show us how fast they can grow. All of this work has been done with some of our employees on the Injured Reserve List, some weeks at a time. Bernie was out for about 6 weeks, Johnny out for a week and Carlos out for some time as well. Happy to have them all healthy and back with us. In the meantime, Joe broke a tooth (on the same day as yours truly) and had to face extraction. Good job, guys!

Those guys aren't the only ones doing a great job. Jessica and Claire have been tearing apart and rearranging the office. Files haven't been cleaned out in decades. Duplicates or triplicates exist making finding files difficult. They emptied out file cabinets, put all the files on the floor, sorted out everything, tossed out or archived the irrelevant and combined files so that info will be easier to find now. You'll see a cleaner, neater, more efficient office next time you visit.

### **BICYCLE REGULATIONS**

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. Golf carts and bikers must follow the same rules as cars. Golf carts and Bikers must ride on the right side of the road at all times. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

Greetings Fellow Photographers! I want to take this opportunity to again extend Congratulations to the winners, and acknowledge ALL the participants, of the 2019 Computer Club Photo Contest. Without your participation there would not be a Photo Contest! There were 21 photographers that actively participated; these individuals submitted a total of 136 photographs in 8 categories. New for 2019, the photographs were displayed on the back wall of the Phase 1 Main Hall for a period of approximately 3 weeks. This was very well received by the all that had an opportunity to see the display. I'd like to thank Park Manager, Tess Schofield, for agreeing to the display. "Thank You Tess!"

The following are the rules and **NEW** categories for the 2020 Holiday Park Computer Club Photo Contest. **PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING VERY CAREFULLY SINCE THERE ARE NUMERUS CHANGES:**

**1. WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?** Any resident of Holiday Park, **owner or renter**, may participate in the HP Computer Club Photo Contest. It is **not** required that you be a member of the Computer Club to participate in the Photo Contest, although we'd **welcome your membership!**

**2. Previous winners are welcome.** However, you may **NOT** resubmit a previous winning photograph. This applies to 1st; 2nd; and 3rd place as well as Honorable Mention. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

**3. Submitted photographs MUST be the work of the individual submitting the photograph(s) and **NOT** from other sources, i.e. the internet or other photographers. **EXCEPTION:** IF the HP Computer Club decides to print photographs for the participants, as was done in the 2019 Contest, this will be the **ONLY EXCEPTION.****

**4. This year there will be two (2) classifications for photographers:**

**A. Beginners:** A "Beginner" is an individual that has **NEVER** participated in a Photo Contest or won a prize for a photograph that they took.

**B. Advanced:** An individual that has, at one time or another, participated in a Photo Contest and was awarded a prize, regardless of the significance of the recognition. A recognition of some type was awarded places the participant in the Advanced Classification.

There will be eight (8) categories for this year's contest. They are as follows:

1. **Black & White:** Any subject that the photographer chooses to submit that is NOT color. IT must be in BLACK & WHITE ONLY.

2. **Plant Life:** Living or dead, not blossoms only but a "PLANT".

3. **Transportation:** Cars; trucks; bicycles; horse drawn carriages/buggies; scooters, etc. The subject MUST be related to some form of transportation. Let your imagination run wild!

4. **Sunsets:** NOT sunrises

5. **Children:**

6. **"Left Behind":** This can be anything that has been abandoned. Old cars, trucks, boats, bicycles, toys, buildings, etc. It doesn't matter as long as the subject of the photograph is no longer being used.

7. **Antiques:**

8. **Animals:** Deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes, etc. Birds **"ARE NOT"** animals. Pictures of birds **WILL NOT** be accepted if submitted.

Do not be concerned about the camera equipment you may or may not have. Any type of camera equipment is acceptable. "Point and shoot" cameras; 35mm SLR cameras; cell phones; I-pads; disposable or one-time use cameras. If it takes pictures it is a camera and it is acceptable!

At the time of Judging the Judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph, if in their opinion, the photograph submitted does not fit the category it was submitted in. It is, and will be, the responsibility of the submitting photographer to select the appropriate Category for the photograph submitted. The decision of the judges **WILL be FINAL!**

The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2) per contestant. **NO MORE** than 16 photographs per contestant shall be allowed. There will be **NO EXCEPTIONS** to this rule.

Entry forms will be provided. **PLEASE, DO NOT** write on the back of the photographs or **tape the entry form to the back of the photograph(s)** submitted for judging.

**ALL** photographs **SHALL** be printed on **PHOTO PAPER** that is 8 x 10 or 8.5 x 11; glossy or matte; with or without borders. Photographs printed on **"card stock"** **WILL NOT** be accepted. Printing can be done at home, at CVS, Walgreens, Walmart, Staples or by a member of the HP Computer Club if they agree to print photographs again this year. There will be a nominal charge to cover HP Computer Club expenses.

Important information such as, photograph submission dates, judging and award dates will be in future newsletter articles.
