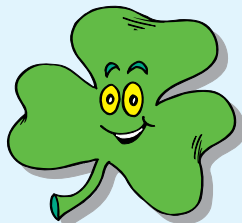

The Board is faced with a number of decisions which it must make prior to the summer break. The last Board meeting takes place the first week of May, and it does not reconvene until October. In the meantime, the contract providing Park employee health insurance expires in September, so the Board must approve a new health benefits package before adjourning for the season. We will be soliciting and considering bids during April.

Secondly, the Board will consider major projects to be accomplished during summer. This year, the renovation of Phase 2 building is on the agenda, with treatment similar to that of the ceramics building -- removal of the brown shingled walls and replaced with stucco concrete and split stone. Underneath all that roofing is electrical conduit which must be rerouted and hidden.

Some have asked what the Park's master plan for capital improvement looks like. Several years ago, we had meetings with residents to let us know what they wanted Holiday Park to look like in 5 to 10 years. We took all the ideas and formed a Capital Improvement Committee of residents who

prioritized the list of projects. That list was then approved by the Board of Trustees. First on the list was a fitness center. That's done. Next was the renovation of the three major buildings, ceramics, Ph 1 and Ph 2. PH 2 building is next to be renovated, followed by a major renovation of Ph 1 next year, including the building interior. We are planning for the three buildings to be completed by the Park's 50th anniversary in 2021. Following those projects was replacing the mile and one-half chain-link fence with a wrought iron (actually aluminum) fence and building a picnic pavilion. Those projects will move up the list as others are completed. The Ph 1 renovation will be the most expensive, probably costing several hundred thousand dollars. Another item on the agenda for April will be consideration of extension of the management contract with Tess Schofield. Her contract runs out in October 2019, so it's only fair to her and the Park to consider extending it well before that date arrives.

In the meantime, please enjoy this beautiful weather and continue to pity those "up north". As always, you can find me at the deep end of the pool.

Holiday Park Education on the Sunshine Law-**Short Summary provided by Karin Anderson, Trustee**

On November 2, 2018 the park attorney did the required yearly Trustee training on the Sunshine Law. The meeting was open to the public. **SUNSHINE LAW;** Provides a right of access to government proceedings. All public agencies including Holiday Park, Park and Recreation District are subject to the Sunshine law.

Sunshine laws are set forth in Fla. Stat. 286.011 and Art. 1, Sec. 24 of the Florida constitution. The Sunshine law extends to discussions and deliberations taken by a public board and is applicable to any gathering (formal or casual) of two or more members of the same board or commission to discuss some matter on which foreseeable action will be taken by the public board or commission

3 BASIC REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN FLORIDA STATUTES 286.011.

1. Meetings of the public must be open to the public;
2. Reasonable notice of such meetings must be provided; and

3. Minutes of the meeting must be taken.

4. **MEETING:** The Sunshine law applies to meetings between individuals who are members of the same board. It applies equally to elected and appointed boards. Members of the board can meet socially, provided that matters which may come before the board are not discussed.

MEETINGS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: The board may adopt rules relating to the orderly conduct of public participation at public meeting or hearings. This includes time limits. When there is a public hearing, then the public always has a right to participate. Time limits may be imposed in these hearings as well. The Sunshine law does not mandate that an agency provide notice of each item to be discussed through a published agenda. Holiday Park provides an agenda and attached materials to any homeowner for review before the meeting. The packet can be taken into the Trustee room for review and returned to the office. If the homeowner wishes to remove information from the office, please notify the office in advance and they will copy the material provided the homeowner pays the copy charges. The information is also posted on-line.

MINUTES: Written minutes of all meetings and workshops must be recorded and open to the public for inspection. The minutes do not need to be a verbatim transcript and do not have to be approved to be released.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. Golf carts and bikers must follow the same rules as cars. Golf carts and Bikers must ride on the right side of the road at all times. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

ACC PERMITS

The Rules and Regulations are designed to maintain the integrity and esthetic value of Holiday Park. We as a committee are here to help maintain this process. Permits are reviewed on the first and third Friday of each month. These meetings are open to all residents. Depending on what your permit is for, you might want to attend in case there are questions the committee might have. When the permits are ap-

proved by the Committee, the office will stamp with a statement and phone number to contact the city of North Port for any permit requirements. You will also sign the permit and initial the stamped portion acknowledging you understand the rules and regulations of the ACC. If you fail to contact the city, you are subject to removal of any and all of the work being done. Also, you may be subject to a fine and possible court appearance. With all the new coaches being built in our park, the inspectors are in the park quite frequently. When filling out the permits, it is required to submit a detailed drawing of the project, including all property lines and all measurements. A plot Plan and/or up to date survey would be helpful and the survey may even be required. When the project is complete, we ask that you turn the permit back into the office to be kept in your file. We as a committee are here to help answer any and all questions in regards to how you want to improve your property. Your may obtain a copy of the ACC Rules and Regulations along with a two-sided permit in the office or on the Holiday Park website under deed restrictions. The permit being on one side and graphed side on the other to help with your drawing if project requires one.

PARKING FOR PICNICS

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard court please park along the side of the courts Do NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks between the parking lot. HOLIDAY PARK ANNUAL PHOTO CONTEST

Greetings Fellow Photographers!

Yes, there WILL be a Holiday Park Photo Contest again this season, 2018-2019! There are some changes and clarifications so please read this article carefully.

The first item of clarification is to address who can participate. Any resident, owner or renter, is considered eligible to participate in the annual HP Photo Contest. Participants DO NOT have to be a member of the Computer Club, but we would welcome new members. Previous winners are welcome. The one rule that does apply is that previous photographs, those that have won First, Second or Third Place or Honorable Mention can NOT be resubmitted. Previous winning photographers ARE eligible to participate in this and future contest. Photographs must be the work of the individual submitting the photograph, NOT photographs from other sources, i.e. The Internet. Photos can be submitted if they have been taken by a phone camera; I-Pad; Inexpensive point and shoot cameras take great pictures and can certainly be used. Expensive or Inexpensive 35mm SLR cameras can also be used. There are NO restrictions regarding cameras.

Another area of clarification is the various categories. During this year's contest the following categories will be used. Please notice the clarifications where appropriate.

1. Adults
2. Children
3. Scenery – Usually defined as Picturesque views or landscapes.
4. Still Life – A picture consisting predominately of INANIMATE OBJECTS; i.e. sea shells on sand; a bowl of fruit; shoes of various colors; an empty chair watching a sunset.
5. Birds
6. Animals – deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes. (birds ARE NOT animals)
7. Bridges
8. Flowers
9. The judges, at the time of judging, will determine if a submitted photograph fits the category selected, by the photographer of the picture being submitted. The judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph that is not properly classified. The decision of the judges will be final.

All photographs shall be printed on photo paper that is 8.5 x 11 inches. The photo can be printed as an 8.5 x 11 or 8 x 10, glossy or matte, color or black & white, with or without a border. Printing can be on home printers OR commercially printed at Wal-Mart, Walgreen's, CVS or Staples. Prints MUST be on photo paper. Card stock prints WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION. The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2); total photographs per photographer/participant shall be 16. These numbers shall be strictly adhered to.

Entry forms will be provided. DO NOT write on the back of your photograph; DO NOT tap the entry form to the back of the photo being submitted. Plastic page saver sheets will be provided for each photo submitted.

Photos may be submitted the week of February 18-21, 2019. They will be accepted from 9:00 – 10:00 AM at the Library in PH 1 Club House. These will be the only dates and times for submissions. NO EXCEPTIONS!! Winners will be announced, and awards presented at the March 26, 2019 Computer Club Meeting.

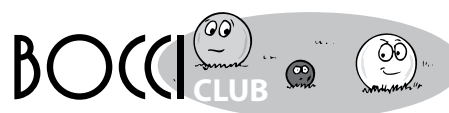

BOCCE

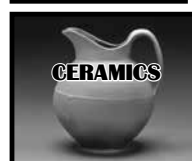
