Of concern to many in our community is the fact that a corporation has purchased more than a dozen homes in our community. The purchasers appear to be Vertica Partners, a multibillion-dollar real estate corporation. We do not yet know their objective, but we ordered our legal counsel to investigate to see if their intent is in the interest of the homeowners of Holiday Park, and if not, to devise a strategy to protect us. We know this same group is also making offers on mobiles in Tri-Par Estates in Sarasota, and undoubtedly other mobile parks. To be sure, they can't easily take over the Park since we have 865 homes, and change would have to be approved by a majority of homeowners. Accordingly, to they would need 433 votes (or own 433 homes) to make any changes to our deed restrictions. Your Board of Trustees is keeping on top of this issue and we have had our attorney help us to ensure our community and way of life is not changed in any substantial manner.

We will be reviewing our Deed Restrictions and making some recommendations for change to ensure that we are positioned to properly defend our Park. These may take the form of limitations on rentals, voting rights and minimum rental times. We understand that is everyone's home, and we are all feeling somewhat uneasy at this potential threat. You may be assured that our Board, Park Manager and attorney will stay completely informed and take any and all action necessary to preserve our way of life. You have excellent management, board and legal counsel who are working to protect us. Stay tuned, as we will keep you informed with postings, meetings, web page and this newsletter. A letter from our attorney with the results of his firm's research on Vertica will be or already is posted on the bulletin board in the office and on the web site. Please read it carefully.

In other news...last month we spotlighted our maintenance and office staff. This month let's look at what I call the unsung heroes who work behind the scenes to keep us operating well and keep our community safe at night. Many know Rich Hatch, our personable weekend maintenance guy. Rich works a tough schedule – split shifts on Saturday and Sunday. He comes in for four hours in the early morning to clean up after Friday evening activities, rearrange the chairs and tables as necessary for Saturday activities, clean the meeting rooms, rest rooms and hallways, and check the pool chemicals. He then comes in the evening for four hours and does it all again. Then both shifts on Sunday. This is a difficult position to fill, and Rich has done a super job of keeping us running on weekends. He also readily fills in for security or maintenance staff extensive absences.

The security staff consists of Dennis McGinty, Doug Boughton, Dave Nichols, Rick Sexton and fill-in Andy Cadieux. These great guys cruise the Park during the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 am 7 days a week. They are not armed and are not authorized to intervene. Their job is to observe and report any suspicious activity to the North Port Police. These guys also man the gates when they are in manual operation due to mechanical or computer glitches.

Holiday Park paid staff of thirteen employees work daily to keep our community clean, safe and in good repair. Stop and chat with them occasionally (briefly, please - they have stuff to do!) and let them know how much you appreciate their work.

In the meantime, you can always find me at the deep end of the pool.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Greetings Fellow Photographers! I want to take this opportunity to again extend Congratulations to the winners, and acknowledge ALL the participants, of the 2019 Computer Club Photo Contest. Without your participation there would not be a Photo Contest! There were 21 photographers that actively participated; these individuals submitted a total of 136 photographs in 8 categories. New for 2019, the photographs were displayed on the back wall of the Phase 1 Main Hall for a period of approximately 3 weeks. This was very well received by the all that had an opportunity to see the display. I'd like to thank Park Manager, Tess Schofield, for agreeing to the display. "Thank You, Tess!"

The following are the rules and **NEW** categories for the 2020 Holiday Park Computer Club Photo Contest. **PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING VERY CAREFULLY SINCE THERE ARE NUMERUS CHANGES:**

1. WHO CAN PARTICIPATE? Any resident of Holiday Park, **owner or renter**, may participate in the HP Computer Club Photo Contest. It is **not** required that you be a member of the Computer Club to participate in the Photo Contest, although we'd **welcome your membership!**

2. Previous winners are welcome. However, you may **NOT** resubmit a previous winning photograph. This applies to 1st; 2nd; and 3rd place as well as Honorable Mention. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

3. Submitted photographs MUST be the work of the individual submitting the photograph(s) and NOT from other sources, i.e. the internet or other photographers. EXCEPTION: IF the HP Computer Club decides to print photographs for the participants, as was done in the 2019 Contest, this will be the ONLY EXCEPTION.

4. This year there will be two (2) classifications for photographers:

A. Beginners: A "Beginner" is an individual that has **NEVER** participated in a Photo Contest or won a prize for a photograph that they took.

B. Advanced: An individual that has, at one time or another, participated in a Photo Contest and was awarded a prize, regardless of the significance of the recognition. A recognition of some type was awarded places the participant in the Advanced Classification.

There will be eight (8) categories for this year's contest. They are as follows:

1. Black & White: Any subject that the photographer chooses to submit that is NOT color. IT must be in BLACK & WHITE ONLY.

2. Plant Life: Living or dead, not blossoms only but a "PLANT".

3. Transportation: Cars; trucks; bicycles; horse drawn carriages/buggies; scooters, etc. The subject MUST be related to some form of transportation. Let your imagination run wild!

4. **Sunsets:** NOT sunrises
5. **Children:**
6. **"Left Behind":** This can be anything that has been abandoned. Old cars, trucks, boats, bicycles, toys, buildings, etc. It doesn't matter as long as the subject of the photograph is no longer being used.
7. **Antiques:**
8. **Animals:** Deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes, etc. Birds **"ARE NOT"** animals. Pictures of birds **WILL NOT** be accepted if submitted.

Do not be concerned about the camera equipment you may or may not have. Any type of camera equipment is acceptable. "Point and shoot" cameras; 35mm SLR cameras; cell phones; I-pads; disposable or one-time use cameras. If it takes pictures it is a camera and it is acceptable!

At the time of Judging the Judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph, if in their opinion, the photograph submitted does not fit the category it was submitted in. It is, and will be, the responsibility of the submitting photographer to select the appropriate Category for the photograph submitted. The decision of the judges **WILL be FINAL!**

The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2) per contestant. **NO MORE** than 16 photographs per contestant shall be allowed. There will be **NO EXCEPTIONS** to this rule.

Entry forms will be provided. PLEASE, DO NOT write on the back of the photographs or **tape the entry form to the back of the photograph(s)** submitted for judging.

ALL photographs **SHALL** be printed on **PHOTO PAPER** that is 8 x 10 or 8.5 x 11; glossy or matte; with or without borders. Photographs printed on **"card stock"** **WILL NOT** be accepted. Printing can be done at home, at CVS, Walgreens, Walmart, Staples or by a member of the HP Computer Club if they agree to print photographs again this year. There will be a nominal charge to cover HP Computer Club expenses.
