We are sending violation notices to homeowners regarding the mold and mildew on homes, and overgrown flower beds, etc. Please be proactive in cleaning your property. See Deed Restrictions below:

(p) All flower beds, planting areas and similar areas on all lots must be kept free of weeds and overgrowth. Lot owners are responsible for removal of mildew from their home. Shrubs and trees must be pruned when needed. Dead shrubs and limbs must be removed. Trees which are removed must have the trunks (base of tree) ground down below the surface of the lawn. Should any lot owner fail to do the above, the District's Board of Trustees may provide for the said service at the lot owner's expense after reasonable notice has been given. Any unpaid fee for said HPARC Expenditures for the Park service shall become a lien on the property where said service is provided.

I want to thank all the residents that complied with violation notices that were sent. It is much appreciated. We want to keep Holiday Park a beautiful place to live. If you are going home for the summer, please ensure the Office has your correct information on file, forwarding address, phone number, and caretaker. Please text the word holidaypark to 941-214-7989. This will enable you to receive text alerts. If you have questions or concerns. My door is always open, and I can meet you in the park or my office. 
