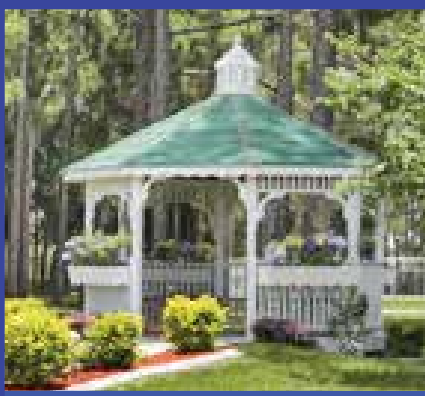

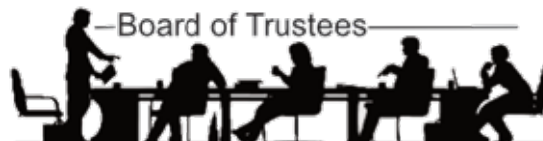

Every year, either four or five Board of Trustee seats come up for election. In the year 2019, four seats are to be contested: Seat 2, held by Don LaMaster, Seat 4 held by Betty Hart, Seat 6, now vacant due to the resignation of Brent Corey, and Seat 8, held by Bill Mitchell. Those interested in filing as a candi-

date for one of the seats must be a Holiday Park homeowner and be registered to vote at that address. Registration packets are available in the HP office. Candidates must file with the Sarasota County Supervisor of Election between noon on December 31, 2018 and noon, January 4, 2019. A twenty-five-dollar filing fee and a personal financial statement is required. Election for trustees is conducted by the Supervisor of Elections, and will take place on Tuesday, March 12, 2019. Eligible to vote are residents of Holiday Park who are registered to vote at their Holiday Park address. Trustees will take office within seven days of the election, per Florida House Bill 1855, our enabling legislation.

Some have voiced the opinion that it is a bit unfair that all homeowners are unable to vote on members of the Board of Trustees, who have so much to do with the operation of Holiday Park, while renters who are registered to vote are eligible. The rules were set up by the Florida legislature, and are unlikely to change.

The Trustees are wrestling with a new problem which is not of our making – that of the large, and what some consider unsightly liquid propane gas tanks installed by the two gas providers who service our Park. The underground distribution system (piping) has corroded and must be abandoned. Neither gas provider finds it worth the expense to put in a new underground system, so tanks are the only solution for those who use gas for cooking, heating or clothes drying. Trustees are considering deed restrictions and/or architectural rules which require screening by barriers or landscaping. We will be discussing this issue at our next few meetings, so if you have an opinion, please attend and let us know. Remember, you may “chime in” at any meeting of the Trustees. We set aside time at the start and end of each meeting for resident comments, and we recognize any resident who wishes to opine prior to voting on any issue. We are fully aware that we represent you, the residents, and are always open to measured and civil comments by all. We welcome your attendance and input.

Thanks to all who put in so much time and effort to decorate our Park for the holidays and who worked at the Men’s Club sale. It always makes me proud to be a resident when I see all the volunteers who jump in to work on the many worthwhile projects here in our small village.

As always, you can find me at the deep end of the pool.

### HOLIDAY PARK DEED RESTRICTIONS

Each homeowner should have a copy of the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. The last version was approved by a majority of the homeowners and submitted in July 2016. As you know, all homeowners must comply with the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. We are in the process of possibly making some minor changes to the deed restrictions. Example: the gas company will no longer provide gas through the underground lines since leaks have developed and it could be dangerous for our residents. Individuals with gas appliances now must use above ground tanks. If you would like to recommend adding or deleting certain deed restrictions, please feel free to send your recommendations to Karin Anderson, Trustee over Rules and Regulations. Your recommendations must be in writing and include your name and phone number. If your recommendation does not contain this information, it will not be considered. This information allows Karin to contact you to discuss your recommendation(s) and to fully understand your concerns and your recommendation. You can turn them into the Holiday Park office and they will be placed in Karin’s trustee box, or you can give it to Karin

directly. We will be taking recommendations through March 2019. Please be aware these are just recommendations. The Trustees will review the list of recommendations at a workshop meeting. The Trustees would then decide what changes, if any, should be considered. The Trustees would then vote on these at a regular Trustee meeting. If the Trustees decide changes should be considered, they will compile a listing of recommendations for the homeowners to vote on in 2020. The process for voting would be made available to all homeowners if recommended deed restrictions are to be submitted in 2020. The costs of doing this process must be part of our budget process. It takes over 50% of our homeowners to approve each change that would be made to the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. If changes are approved by the homeowners, the new Holiday Park Deed Restrictions would be filed with the state and the new updated Holiday Park Deed Restrictions would be made available to each homeowner.

As you can see, this is a long process and the Holiday Park Trustees appreciate our homeowners’ participation in this process.

### HOUSE BILL 1855

I would like to take a few minutes to educate our residents on House Bill 1855. I’m not going to go into all the legal details of the bill. It would take a lawyer several days to explain it. I’m also not as good explaining this as Dick Gortz is, but I hope you will be patient with me. Our Park is set up under House Bill 1855. It makes us a special district. Our full name is Holiday Park and Recreation District. As a special district we have numerous privileges as well as numerous responsibilities. As a special district we are set up like a city and have the same types of responsibilities as a city.

Our Trustees have to be elected in a Sarasota County election. That means our homeowners and Trustee candidates who are Florida residents, and registered voters listing their Holiday Park address as their legal residence, are the only ones who can vote for the 9 Trustees or are eligible to be a trustee. The Trustees must provide personal Financials every year to the state. We must also sign ethics agreements as required by Sarasota county. We must have yearly Sunshine Law training. There are numerous legal requirements because we are a special district. Our responsibilities and authority are more extensive than those communities run by a board that is part of a community Home Owners Association. We can set budgets, change our yearly assessments, and numerous other items. We are entrusted under the law with the legal management of the park. Now let’s talk about some of the positives for the park. We as homeowners pay tax on our mobile home and the property, we own in Holiday Park. The Park does not pay tax on our club houses, pools, tennis and pickle ball courts, horse-shoe pits, bocce courts, shuffle board, compounds and all our open property. REPEAT: We do not pay property taxes on these areas. What does this mean to each homeowner? Our monthly fees would be much greater than they are now if we were not set up under House Bill 1855 and were taxed on these areas. In addition to that benefit, we do not have to pay sales tax on materials for projects we do in the park. For example: When we bought our Park truck, golf carts, and air conditioners, we were not taxed. Our food for our dinners and picnics is not taxed as well. What a fantastic benefit that is!

As Trustees, we value the benefits of House Bill 1855 and being a special district. As Trustees, we also take our responsibilities seriously to comply with all the restrictions and regulations that govern our activities. We do not want to do anything

that would jeopardize the benefits of House Bill 1855. We must comply with all requirements and responsibilities; we have no choice.

Yes, there WILL be a Holiday Park Photo Contest again this season, 2018-2019! There are some changes and clarifications so please read this article carefully.

The first item of clarification is to address who can participate. Any resident, owner or renter, is considered eligible to participate in the annual HP Photo Contest. Participants DO NOT have to be a member of the Computer Club, but we would welcome new members. Previous winners are welcome. The one rule that does apply is that previous photographs, those that have won First, Second or Third Place or Honorable Mention can NOT be resubmitted. Previous winning photographers ARE eligible to participate in this and future contest. Photographs must be the work of the individual submitting the photograph, NOT photographs from other sources, i.e. The Internet. Photos can be submitted if they have been taken by a phone camera; I-Pad; Inexpensive point and shoot cameras take great pictures and can certainly be used. Expensive or Inexpensive 35mm SLR cameras can also be used. There are NO restrictions regarding cameras.

Another area of clarification is the various categories. During this year's contest the following categories will be used. Please notice the clarifications where appropriate.

1. Adults
2. Children
3. Scenery – Usually defined as Picturesque views or landscapes.
4. Still Life – A picture consisting predominately of INANIMATE OBJECTS; i.e. sea shells on sand; a bowl of fruit; shoes of various colors; an empty chair watching a sunset.

5. Birds

6. Animals – deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes. (birds ARE NOT animals).

7. Bridges

8. Flowers

9. The judges, at the time of judging, will determine if a submitted photograph fits the category selected, by the photographer of the picture being submitted. The judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph that is not properly classified. The decision of the judges will be final.

All photographs shall be printed on photo paper that is 8.5 x 11 inches. The photo can be printed as an 8.5 x 11 or 8 x 10, glossy or matte, color or black & white, with or without a border. Printing can be on home printers OR commercially printed at Wal-Mart, Walgreen's, CVS or Staples. Prints MUST be on photo paper. Card stock prints WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION. The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2); total photographs per photographer/participant shall be 16. These numbers shall be strictly adhered to.

Entry forms will be provided. DO NOT write on the back of your photograph; DO NOT tap the entry form to the back of the photo being submitted. Plastic page saver sheets will be provided for each photo submitted.

Photos may be submitted the week of February 18-21, 2019. They will be accepted from 9:00 – 10:00 AM at the Library in PH 1 Club House. These will be the only dates and times for submissions. NO EXCEPTIONS!! Winners will be announced, and awards presented at the March 12, 2019 Computer Club Meeting.
