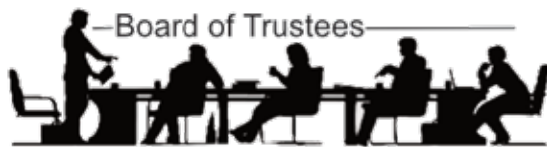
Be careful out walking and biking here in Park. Traffic is picking up every day. Stay safe....

Well, as they say, I've got good news and I've got bad news. Let's start with the bad news and finish up on a high note. As you have probably heard, Wayne Schofield, who has been our Park Manager for the past nine years resigned for a more responsible position in Bradenton. He now manages a large community with a golf course, restaurant, nine swimming pools and more than a thousand residential units. Of course, with that increased responsibility comes a much larger salary. We wish him well and know that the residents of his new assignment will appreciate him as much as we have. Wayne's accomplishments here have been many, not the least of which is the start of our remodeling of our buildings, which will continue. He leaves a legacy of great accomplishment here in Holiday Park. Other than his building and remodeling projects, he leaves a management system which was sorely lacking when he came. Wayne leaves Holiday Park in much better condition than when he came, which makes transition to a new manager much easier.

We also note the loss of Trustee Brent Corey, who has

purchased a home in Venice. Brent and his wife Susanne have been fixtures in the leadership of this community, and they will be sincerely missed. Brent has contributed much to the information that the Board needed to make proper and informed decisions. He was the guy to dig into the details and bring to the Board the fruits of his research, which made our job easier and our decisions so much more certain. Susanne spent many years on the HOA Board, and we thank her for her service to the Park. We wish them well in their new digs.

Now for the good news! The Board of Trustees has approved a one-year management contract with Tess Schofield, Wayne's wife. Like Wayne, she is a Licensed Community Association Manager with impressive credentials. Following 5 years in the U.S. Army intelligence, she managed a Racket and Fitness club. Her past eight years have been spent in management of communities in Florida. She managed Quail Run, a 55 plus, 27 building condo association where she was also responsible for a major renovation of their buildings. She then managed a luxury lifestyle community in Cape Haze, and a 22-building condo cluster. In these jobs, she was responsible for budgets, maintenance, personnel and attending association meetings. Her references are impeccable.

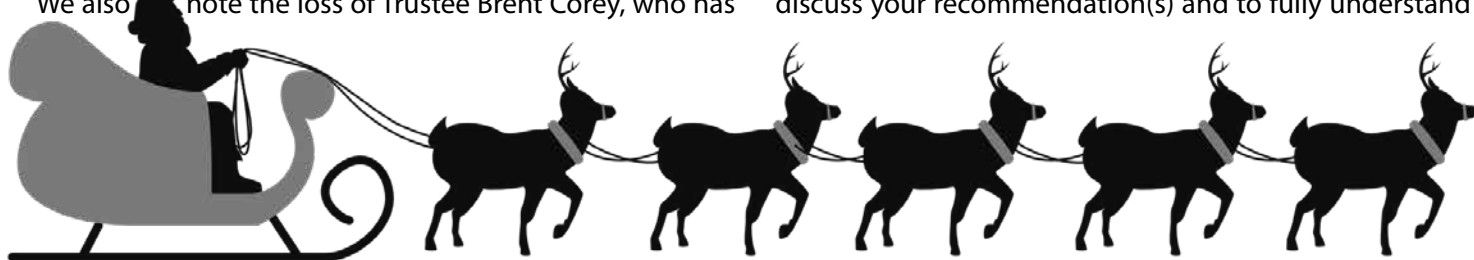
Wayne and Tess have 3 children, one of whom is in the Air Force, and one a pre-med grad who will enter medical school next year. Their daughter is a senior in high school. Hiring Tess made sense to the Board of Trustees. When Wayne was hired, it took 6 months to fill the job. We are now entering our busy season, and it would be very difficult on staff to handle the workload without a manager in place. Tess knows our community well and many in our community know her. She has been a fixture alongside Wayne at many social events and regularly attended our trustee meetings. Her references are excellent. While we have approved a one-year agreement with her, the Board may extend it at any time or cancel it. Knowing Tess, I'm sure we will be extending her contract well before the current agreement expires. Tess has been visible in the park the past several weeks, so please stop and welcome her to Holiday Park. As always, you can find me at the deep end of the pool.

Holiday Park Deed Restrictions

Each homeowner should have a copy of the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. The last version was approved by a majority of the homeowners and submitted in July 2016.

As you know, all homeowners must comply with the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. We are in the process of possibly making some minor changes to the deed restrictions. Example, the gas company will no longer provide gas through the underground lines since leaks have developed and it could be dangerous for our residents. Individuals with gas appliances now must use above ground tanks. If you would like to recommend adding or deleting certain deed restrictions, please feel free to send your recommendations to Karin Anderson, Trustee over Rules and Regulations. Your recommendations must be in writing and include your name and phone number. If your recommendation does not contain this information, it will not be considered. This information allows Karin to contact you to discuss your recommendation(s) and to fully understand your



concerns and your recommendation. You can turn them into the Holiday Park office and they will be placed in Karin's trustee box, or you can give it to Karin directly. We will be taking recommendations through March 2019. Please be aware these are just recommendations. The Trustees will review the list of recommendations at a workshop meeting. The Trustees would then decide what changes, if any, should be considered. The Trustees would then vote on these at a regular Trustee meeting. If the Trustees decide changes should be considered, they will compile a listing of recommendations for the homeowners to vote on in 2020. The process for voting would be made available to all homeowners if recommended deed restrictions are to be submitted in 2020.

The costs of doing this process must be part of our budget process. It takes over 50% of our homeowners to approve each change that would be made to the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. If changes are approved by the homeowners, the new Holiday Park Deed Restrictions would be filed with the state and the new updated Holiday Park Deed Restrictions would be made available to each homeowner.

As you can see, this is a long process and the Holiday Park Trustees appreciate our homeowners' participation in this process.

TRUSTEE ASSIGNMENTS and the HIRING PROCESS

I think it is important to do some education with our residents on Trustee assignments and the hiring process.

Each Trustee after being sworn in is given a book containing all the Park rules and regulations, etc. They are also given an assignment of an area in which they are responsible to work with the Park Manager. Example: I'm over rules and regulations, Bill Mitchell is over security and Dick Gortz is over personnel. I won't go over each assignment right now. They are listed in the newsletter, and the website also lists responsibilities and the Trustee to whom they are assigned. Our books have a Trustee section that explains our assigned responsibilities. Dick, as the Chairperson, is also over personnel and he can recommend a candidate for a position. Normally the Park Manager and Dick interview the candidate together and the Park Manager contacts the references. Wayne will also consult with the Trustee over the area he is hiring for. Example: if it is a maintenance employee he will work with Don LaMaster. Wayne does not need to submit the application for approval in a Trustee's meeting. He does submit his recommendation to the Trustees when the employee has completed his/her 90-day probationary period.

The initial process of hiring a new Park Manager would fall totally with Dick since he is over personnel. Dick took one additional step in our standard process by checking with our attorney before beginning the initial process.

When he received the application from Tess Schofield, he placed it on the agenda for one of the upcoming meetings and the application was placed in each Trustee's mailbox for review before the meeting. The Trustees did not discuss the application with him or with each other. He is responsible for doing the initial interview and he wrote up the questions and her answers without inserting his opinion to any of them and placed it in our Trustee mailbox. He then is responsible for calling her references. He again wrote their responses up without inserting his opinion, and again placed it in the Trustee mailboxes.

Again, this is the initial part of the process. Dick is not hiring the Manager, but is the Trustee assigned to personnel and responsible for the initial part of the process. The Trustees at the workshop and general meeting discuss the candidate and the Trustees have the final say for hiring the Park Manager.

For example, when we hired Wayne, the Chairperson at that time was also responsible for personnel and she interviewed him and called his references before the application was submitted to the Trustees for approval. This is our standard procedure.

It is interesting to note that at that time, some of the Trustees were not confident Wayne could do the job. They felt that since he had a young family, he wouldn't last for over a year. They finally agreed to hire him and give him the support to do the job. Hard to believe he lasted 9 years and did an outstanding job. Any Manager we hire must have our support to continue to keep our Park outstanding. I know this can seem confusing to those who are normally not involved in the process. But behind the scenes the same approved process is consistently followed. We are so lucky to live in such a great community run by volunteers in all areas of the Park. Let's all try to support our volunteers and the new Park Manager, looking at all the positive aspects of what we have.

VOLUNTEER NEEDED FOR ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

Can you believe it is December already? I have a Correction on the date for the

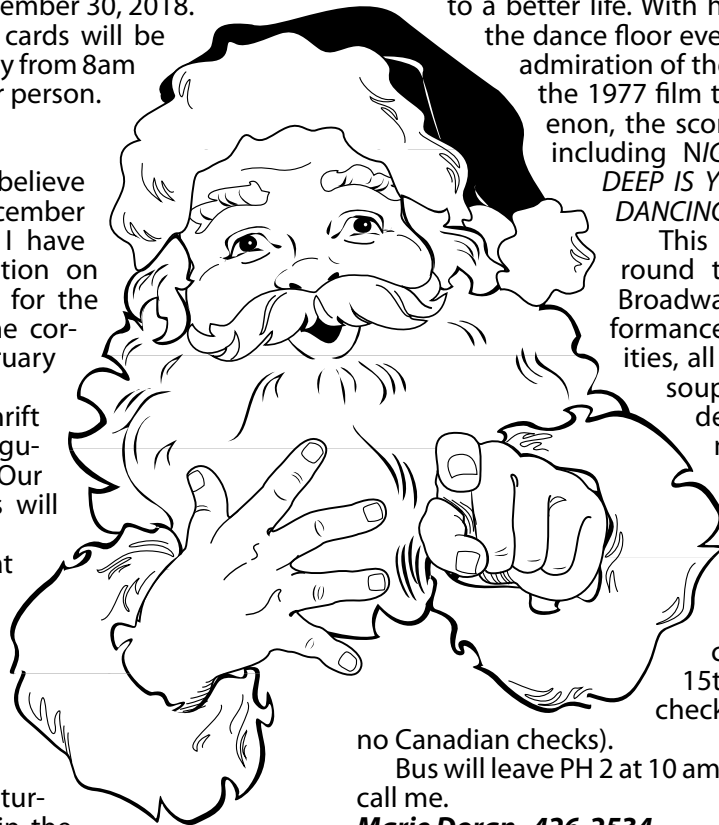
Immokalee gambling bus trip. The correct date is February 6th--NOT February 1st. Sorry about that!

Yes, there WILL be a Holiday Park Photo Contest again this season, 2018-2019! There are some changes and clarifications

so please read this article carefully.

The first item of clarification is to address who can participate. Any resident, owner or renter, is considered eligible to participate in the annual HP Photo Contest. Participants DO NOT have to be a member of the Computer Club, but we would welcome new members. Previous winners are welcome. The one rule that does apply is that previous photographs, those that have won First, Second or Third Place or Honorable Mention can NOT be resubmitted. Previous winning photographers ARE eligible to participate in this and future contest.

Photographs must be the work of the individual submitting the photograph, NOT photographs from other sources, i.e. The Internet. Photos can be submitted if they have been taken by a phone camera; I-Pad; Inexpensive point and shoot cameras take great pictures and can certainly be used. Expensive or Inexpensive 35mm SLR cameras can also be used. There are NO restrictions regarding cameras.

Another area of clarification is the various categories. During this year's contest the following categories will be used. Please notice the clarifications where appropriate.

1. Adults
2. Children
3. Scenery – Usually defined as picturesque views or landscapes.
4. Still Life – A picture consisting predominately of INANIMATE OBJECTS; i.e. sea shells on sand; a bowl of fruit; shoes of various colors; an empty chair watching a sunset.
5. Birds
6. Animals – deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes. (birds ARE NOT animals)
7. Bridges
8. Flowers

The judges, at the time of judging, will determine if a submitted photograph fits the category selected, by the photographer of the picture being submitted. The judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph that is not properly classified. The decision of the judges will be final.

All photographs shall be printed on photo paper that is 8.5 x 11 inches. The photo can be printed as an 8.5 x 11 or 8 x 10, glossy or matte, color or black & white, with or without a border. Printing can be on home printers OR commercially printed at Wal-Mart, Walgreen's, CVS or Staples. Prints MUST be on photo paper. Card stock prints WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AND ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR CONSIDERATION. The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2); total photographs per photographer/participant shall be 16. These numbers shall be strictly adhered to.

Entry forms will be provided. DO NOT write on the back of your photograph; DO NOT tap the entry form to the back of the photo being submitted. Plastic page saver sheets will be provided for each photo submitted.

Photos may be submitted the week of February 18-21, 2019. They will be accepted from 9:00 – 10:00 AM at the Library in PH 1 Club House. These will be the only dates and times for submissions.
