BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park: Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. Golf carts and bikers must follow the same rules as cars. Golf carts and Bikers must ride on the right side of the road at all times. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park.

A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

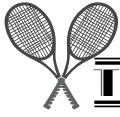
The Shuffleboard Traveling Team held their own this year ranking five out of eight out of the other participating parks.
