It is great to see so many Park residence walking, biking, and enjoying golf cart rides, which is extremely healthy. Because of the increased activity I find it necessary to remind everyone that the Park speed limit has not changed! It is still 15 MPH. Please be considered of the walkers, bikers, and golf carts. As you might expect the HOA's income has been adversely affected by the Covid-19 Pandemic. The financial statement for April indicates that income is down by \$6403.18. That said, expenses are down by \$12,871.97 for a net income of \$6468.79. The full report will be posted in the window/door of the Phase I Hall. In the meantime, until HOA Activities return to "Normal", there really is not a lot to report. I know that it is not easy being confined and with no, or restricted, activities. I just try to remember that this too shall pass and when it does what a celebration we will enjoy. My prayer again this month is that you all will remain healthy and if you are ill, you will have a speedy recovery.

One final thought: We are ALL in this Covid-19 "boat" together! We ALL are being denied access to many of the customs, traditions and sports activities, churches, hospital visitations, family members and the list is endless. Holiday Park has been fortunate that we have had no virus cases reported. That fact and the federal and state loosening of shutdown rules has led to some residents inquiring when facilities will be open. It is a rare day that trustees are not confronted by residents asking that the facilities to be open. Please be assured that we take your opinions and desires seriously.

In mid-May, we opened some courts and the Ph 1 pool for limited use. Other recreation facilities (such as clubhouses, fitness center and meeting rooms) remain closed. The decision as to which facilities to open or close is made by consensus of the trustees and park manager after carefully considering the recommendation of the Florida Department of Health, Sarasota and North Port government entities and local conditions. By virtue of Holiday Park being an over 55 facility, we are in the "high-risk population" category as determined by the FL. Health Dept. and must follow the most stringent guidelines. The Park must assure that whatever facility is open, we maintain "social distancing" at all times, and that surfaces touched by residents are disinfected frequently. Those conditions are most difficult to maintain at the pool, fitness center or in meeting rooms.

We are sure that most of our residents understand that the decisions the Board of Trustees makes regarding which facilities are open and on what schedule is being made only with the good health and safety of our residents in mind. We would be remiss should we open facilities contrary to the best advice of professionals, and the virus

ANNOUNCEMENT FROM PARK MANAGER**& BOARD OF TRUSTEES:**

Some activities in Holiday Park will be opened for use as of May 18th. Please review these rules, which are based on the best advice of our federal, state and local health officials. The overriding requirement is the safety of Holiday Park residents. These openings are for Holiday Park residents only; no guests or family relatives are allowed.

Holiday Park badges are to be worn. This is a temporary test: if the rules are not followed, or the corona virus cases in our area or In Florida increase, these activities may be closed. Social distancing is to be observed in all venues by players and observers. Presently, no groups in excess of 10 people.

Cleaning

The person in charge of each activity is charged with responsibility of assuring clean equipment after each use. Cleaning supplies will be provided.

Tennis & Pickleball

Bocci

Please always maintain social distancing. Four players may play on each court (2 at each end).

Phase 1 Pool

The pool will be opened between 8am and 2pm only, Monday through Friday. Residents may reserve a one-hour time slot between 8 and 2 by calling the office. Each hour will be limited to 6 people at a time, 3 people in the shallow end and 3 in the deep end.

Swimmers will be admitted to the pool area only during their reserved time. No chairs will be provided. You may bring your own chair each time. The office staff will clean pool rail and shower handles every hour. Swimmers may be asked to vacate the pool area 5 minutes early to allow for cleaning.

Phase 2 pool will remain closed for the time being. Sign-ups will be the day before the desired day and time to prohibit people from stacking giving everyone an opportunity to use the pool.

PARK MANAGER

To all residents that are medically-dependent residing in Holiday Park during hurricane season. Please contact Sarasota County and apply NOW for registration as a medically-dependent person (MDP). Examples are use of oxygen or medical equipment that requires electricity. It is important to apply in advance for this program so, if qualified, you will be on the county's registry for transportation and sheltering at a medically-dependent Evacuation Center during a disaster. BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS CARS. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST RIDE ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ALL TIMES. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

You are only allowed one ride a week so you must plan accordingly. You must call 941-474-8802 the day before between 8 AM and 3 PM. They charge \$5 for a ride round-trip to a North Port location. They charge \$10 for a ride round-trip to Port Charlotte, Venice, or Englewood.

Tuesday- they drive individuals to Walmart. Thursday- they drive individuals to Publix, Winn Dixie, and Aldi's. Please remember if you do grocery shopping, that counts as your once weekly trip. So, plan accordingly.

Home Exercise Routines

Adding a fitness routine to your daily schedule is a great way to stay in shape both mentally and physically. Many of us are missing our regularly scheduled fitness activities offered in our communities or at our local gyms, but that doesn't mean you can't stay fit at home! Check out these exercise suggestions below for an effective at-home workout. The number of repetitions and sets of each exercise is up to you. You can customize this routine based on the amount of time you have.

*** If you're new to an exercise routine, please obtain clearance from your medical doctor before starting a new program or attempting any of these activities.

Warm-Up. First, warm up your body! If you can, go on a brisk 5-10-minute walk around your neighborhood to get your muscles warmed up. Prefer to stay inside? March in place, step side to side, or turn on your favorite tunes and dance around the living room for a few minutes. After heating up your muscles, dedicate some time to your joints. Think about starting at the top of your body and working your way down. Move your head left and right and tilt your head side to side to warm up your neck. Raise your shoulders up and down, then add some shoulder circles. Roll your shoulders forward for 30 seconds or so then reverse the motion rolling your shoulders back maintaining the circular pattern. Holding your arms out directly in front of you (you may choose to sit in a chair), do some wrist circles in one direction and then reverse the motion. Next, stand with your legs hip width apart, slowly making a figure 8 shape with your hips. Continue in one direction for about 30 seconds and then reverse. Have a seat in a chair and lift one foot off the ground and begin making circles with your ankle. Start in one direction, then reverse the motion. Repeat with the other ankle. Whatever warm-up you prefer, the goal is to warm your

muscles and joints to prepare your body for exercise.

Chair Squats. If you have knee issues, you may choose to skip this exercise (please consult with your doctor). Squats are a great way to strengthen your lower body. If you can, find two chairs to use for this exercise. One chair will be used for squatting, and the other chair will be used for balance. Place the chairs one behind the other facing the same direction leaving enough room for you to stand between the two chairs. Place your hands on the chair in front of you for balance, then slowly push your hips back, bend your knees, and lower your body to the chair. You may choose to lightly sit on the chair or barely touch it before standing up and returning to the starting position.

Wall Push Ups. Wall pushups are a great way to strengthen your upper body. Stand about two feet behind a wall and place your hands on the wall about shoulder height. Begin to bend your elbows out to the sides as you bring your face and chest close to the wall. Your heels will most likely come off the floor – that's ok! Press your hands into the wall to straighten your elbows and return to the starting position.

Toe Stands. Grab one of the chairs you used for the squatting exercise and stand directly behind it using the chair for balance. Slowly raise up onto your tiptoes then slowly lower your heels back to the floor.

Knee Extensions. Using the same chair, have a seat keeping your back straight and knees bent. One leg at a time, slowly extend your leg out in front of you. Hold this position for a few seconds and then lower back to the starting position. Repeat with opposite leg.

Chest Expansions. While still sitting in your chair. Bring your arms straight out in front of you (shoulder height) and place your palms together. As you inhale, open your arms wide extending your fingertips in opposite directions. As you exhale, bring your arms back to the starting position. Continue moving in these motions along with your breath.

Relax. At the end of your routine, you may choose to stay sitting in your chair for a little relaxation time. You're encouraged to maintain proper posture and place your hands in your lap. If you'd like, close your eyes and take a few deep breaths. Imagine your favorite person, place, or thing; think about anything that brings you joy and gratitude. With a smile on your face, slowly blink your eyes open, take one last deep breath, and celebrate the positive work you just completed for your body and mind!

POOR MAN'S BURRITO BOWLS

These easy, no-frills burrito bowls are super-fast and affordable.


Ingredients:

- 2 cups uncooked rice
- 2 cans of black beans
- 1 can Mexicom (or regular corn)
- ½ tsp. cumin
- ¼ tsp. garlic powder
- 1-16 oz. jar salsa
- 6 oz. Velveeta Cheese (or fresh shredded cheese (if available))

Instructions:

Cook rice according to package directions. While rice is cooking, make the beans. Add both cans of black beans (undrained) to a small sauce pot, along with the cumin and garlic powder. Heat over medium heat, stirring often, until heated through.

Once the rice is cooked, build the bowls. Add one cup of cooked rice, ½ cup warm black beans, ½ cup corn, 1/3 cup salsa, and add 1 oz. sliced Velveeta or shredded cheese (about ¼ cup) to each bowl.
