This past month had us busy with Pot Luck Dinner--and what a wonderful dinner it was. Was to all who helped at dinner and all of you for cooking such great food.

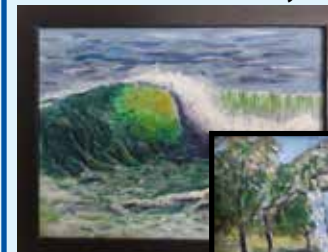

—Board of Trustees— Residents should be aware that our deed restrictions prohibit turning carports into living spaces. We have a small number of residents who have put chairs, tables plant pots and other furniture in the carport to the point that those carports are now unable to house a vehicle. Specifically, our deed restrictions state, "No carport shall be used as a storage area or as an outdoor living space." Remember, carports are for cars, and are not to be converted into outdoor lanais. Having a few patio chairs is permitted, but some have put 3 or 4 large chairs, tables, rugs etc. This is prohibited by our deed restrictions. You may build a lanai or a patio, but you may not turn a carport into a lanai. If you can't park a car in your carport because of furniture, you're probably not in compliance.

The Board of Trustees do not establish deed restrictions. Deed restrictions have been written by the homeowners of our community to set the standards they expect of all residents. The Board of Trustees has the unenviable duty of enforcing those standards. That's its job, and trustees take an oath to do so. We really can't "just look the other way". When you move into a deed restricted community such as ours, you give up some freedoms to do what you wish with your home. You must follow the rules as established by the homeowners of the community. We are certain that residents wish to voluntarily comply with deed restrictions established by our homeowners. Check your carport. If you are not in compliance with our deed restrictions, please take remedial action. At some time, Park management will conduct an inspection of carports. Those in violation will be notified by letter and asked to comply. We ask for your full cooperation.

We have some new faces in our Park office. Please stop in and say "hi" to Barbara Vitolo and Lisa Hoover. Lisa is returning to Holiday Park after working here about 7 years ago. Barb has an extensive background in banking and accounting. We sincerely welcome them to our community.

Election for Holiday Park Board of Trustee seats 1, 3, 5, 7 & 9 will take place on Tuesday March 17, 2020. Candidates must file with the Sarasota County Supervisor of Elections between January 6th and noon on January 10th. Trustees elected to those seats will take office on Thursday, March 19th. Packets with qualifying information and filing forms may be picked up in the Holiday Park office or at one of the Election Supervisor's offices.

EDUCATION FOR HOLIDAY PARK HOMEOWNERS WHO RENT THEIR PROPERTY

It was apparent at our informational meeting on November 14, that a few of our residents did not know the existing Holiday Park rental guidelines. The Holiday Park Deed Restrictions, on page 11, require residents to submit a written application for the approval of their rentals. This application asks for information and supporting documentation including, but not limited to, verifiable proof of age(s) of proposed occupants, pets, etc., for Trustees to review and approve or deny. This must be accompanied by a \$50 administrative fee. Those who have rental properties must submit an application for approval for each rental. If it is a continuous rental that renews each year, they

must submit only one application and one fee. Each year they must re-certify the application and the new date is recorded. If the rental period is less than a year, it requires an application for each rental period with the appropriate application fee. Also, Holiday Park General Rules and the Deed Restrictions require that all Holiday Park renters be registered at the Park office.

All renters and residents are required to be registered and have a name badge to access facilities and activities in the Park.

Any homeowners who presently have renters who have not filled out the appropriate application, please come to the Park office and pick up application forms for submittal.

All homeowners in Holiday Park, when purchasing property, agreed to abide by the Holiday Park Deed Restrictions. They are enforceable, and will be enforced.

The Homeowners Association, Men's Club, and Just Us Girls will be checking renters' and residents' name tags when selling tickets to various activities.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. Golf carts and bikers must follow the same rules as cars. Golf carts and Bikers must ride on the right side of the road at all times. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard courts, please park along the side of the courts. DO NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks between the parking lot, the shuffleboard court and the kitchen. Golf cart parking is also available in the designated spaces of the parking lots in front of the club house and on the side of the club house. The change in parking for the picnic is to give the workers room to get from the charcoal cookers to the serving tables and to the beverage area. Please do not park in spaces obviously designated for cars. The entry ways will be the same as always—on both sides of the big tree. Please abide by the NO PARKING lines. Sometimes golf carts, scooters, bikes and cars are parked on these painted lines which mean NO PARKING in this space. This is important so that there is always access for emergency vehicles if they are needed. It's important to remember that all residential lots in Holiday Park are private property and require permission from the owners if you want to walk across their property or park on their property.

MEN'S CLUB VALENTINE'S BREAKFAST

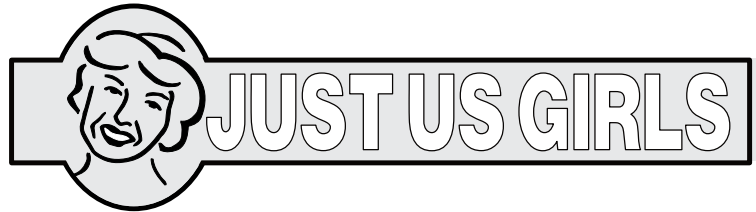

The following are the rules and **NEW** categories for the 2020 Holiday Park Computer Club Photo Contest. **PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING VERY CAREFULLY SINCE THERE ARE NUMERUS CHANGES:**

1. WHO CAN PARTICIPATE? Any resident of Holiday Park, **owner or renter**, may participate in the HP Computer Club Photo Contest. It is **not** required that you be a member of the Computer Club to participate in the Photo Contest, although we'd **welcome your membership!**

2. Previous winners are welcome. However, you may **NOT** resubmit a previous winning photograph. This applies to 1st; 2nd; and 3rd place as well as Honorable Mention. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**

3. Submitted photographs MUST be the work of the individual submitting the photograph(s) and NOT from other sources, i.e. the internet or other photographers. **EXCEPTION:** IF the HP Computer Club decides to print photographs for the participants, as was done in the 2019 Contest, this will be the **ONLY EXCEPTION.**

4. This year there will be two (2) classifications for photographers:

A. Beginners: A "Beginner" is an individual that has **NEVER** participated in a Photo Contest or won a prize for a photograph that they took.

B. Advanced: An individual that has, at one time or an-

other, participated in a Photo Contest and was awarded a prize, regardless of the significance of the recognition. A recognition of some type was awarded places the participant in the Advanced Classification.

There will be eight (8) categories for this year's contest. They are as follows:

1. Black & White: Any subject that the photographer chooses to submit that is NOT color. IT must be in BLACK & WHITE ONLY.

2. Plant Life: Living or dead, not blossoms only but a "PLANT".

3. Transportation: Cars; trucks; bicycles; horse drawn carriages/buggies; scooters, etc. The subject MUST be related to some form of transportation. Let your imagination run wild!

4. Sunsets: NOT sunrises

5. Children:

6. "Left Behind": This can be anything that has been abandoned. Old cars, trucks, boats, bicycles, toys, buildings, etc. It doesn't matter as long as the subject of the photograph is no longer being used.

7. Antiques:

8. Animals: Deer, squirrels, spiders, snakes, etc. Birds **"ARE NOT"** animals. Pictures of birds **WILL NOT** be accepted if submitted.

Do not be concerned about the camera equipment you may or may not have. Any type of camera equipment is acceptable. "Point and shoot" cameras; 35mm SLR cameras; cell phones; I-pads; disposable or one-time use cameras. If it takes pictures it is a camera and it is acceptable!

At the time of Judging the Judges will have the option of disqualifying a photograph, if in their opinion, the photograph submitted does not fit the category it was submitted in. It is, and will be, the responsibility of the submitting photographer to select the appropriate Category for the photograph submitted. The decision of the judges **WILL be FINAL!**

The number of photographs per category shall be limited to two (2) per contestant. **NO MORE** than 16 photographs per contestant shall be allowed. There will be **NO EXCEPTIONS** to this rule.

Entry forms will be provided. PLEASE, DO NOT write on the back of the photographs or **tape the entry form to the back of the photograph(s)** submitted for judging.

ALL photographs **SHALL** be printed on **PHOTO PAPER** that is 8 x 10 or 8.5 x 11; glossy or matte; with or without borders. Photographs printed on **"card stock" WILL NOT** be accepted. Printing can be done at home, at CVS, Walgreens, Walmart, Staples or by a member of the HP Computer Club if they agree to print photographs again this year. There will be a nominal charge to cover HP Computer Club expenses.

Helping Hand will drive you to get groceries, to the pharmacy and to your doctor appointment. For individuals who no longer drive, this is a special service for you as well. Remember, they are volunteers who have limited time. Please call 48 hours before you need a ride. This allows individuals to work their schedule around your needs. We will gladly help any residents, but remember we need notice. We also have medical equipment such as walkers, shower chairs, etc., available for our residents to meet your needs. All the Helping Hand phone numbers are in the Holiday Park newsletter.

FISH (A North Port Volunteer Organization)

Fish is a volunteer organization that can drive North Port Residents to physician appts., to get your medications, or to go shopping for groceries. They cannot take anyone with a wheelchair. You are only allowed one ride a week so you must plan accordingly. You must call 941-474-8802 the day before between 8 AM and 3 PM. They charge \$5 for a ride round-trip

to a North Port location.

They charge \$10 for a ride round-trip to Port Charlotte, Venice, or Englewood.

Tuesday- they drive individuals to Walmart.

Thursday- they drive individuals to Publix, Winn Dixie, and Aldi's

Please remember if you do grocery shopping, that counts as your once weekly trip. So, plan accordingly.
