Greetings Friends & Neighbors:

As I sit down to write this month's letter I think of the movie "GHOST", which starred Demi Moore as Molly and Patrick Swayze as Sam! In the scene I recall, Molly tells Sam that she loves him, to which he replies "Ditto"! Well, I feel that I could imitate Sam and say "DITTO" and this month's newsletter would be finished and I would save everyone the time it would take to read my remarks. With that said, I cannot save you any time because I have a few items to share with you. Sorry!

Unfortunately, I must remind a few individuals (fortunately it is only a few, but it's always the same few and that's too many) that reside in Holiday Park, that the Park speed limit is **STILL A MAXIMUM 15 MPH!** This is for everyone's safety. I cannot stress the importance of observing the posted speed limit enough. No one wants to be involved in a tragedy. **PLEASE SLOW DOWN!** Thank You!

Unfortunately, because of Covid-19, the HOA has not been able to post the monthly financial report. The latest figures available are as follows:

October 2019 through May 2020 Actual Income is: \$29,096.91, which is \$6403.09 LESS than projected.

October 2019 through May 2020 Actual Expense are: \$22,923.72, which is \$12,576.28 LESS than expected.

Bottom line is this: Income is down, expenses are down and when COVID-19 is gone, and we are back to "normal" and can start having HOA activities, with your support, we will still be able to assist the Park and hopefully help keep our (you and me) monthly assessment from increasing. That is what we do! We support Holiday Park, making it the wonderful place it is to live in. For that, on behalf of the HOA I say, "THANK YOU!" By the way, since the Phase 1 lobby is available, on a limited bases during business hours, I will be posting the monthly Profit & Loss Statements in the "side light" of the doors to Phase 1 Main Hall.

Now that July has arrived so has some good news. The Phase 1 & 2 pools are available on a first come bases (with a limit of 6 persons at a time) and that appears to be working well. The Men's Club Shed is open for business, on a limited schedule, Monday's from 9 till Noon for the summer, but it is open. The outdoor courts are open for tennis and pickleball if "social distancing" is properly observed. The Park is slowly returning to a "new normal" with the hope that there is not a repeat of the necessary restrictions that were implemented, and we all experienced, during March, April, May, and into June.

Finally, hurricane season officially began on June 1st and runs through November 30th, which means we have 5 full months that we need to be prepared to evaluate in the event of a major storm. Remember to have extra batteries; have a NOAA Weather Radio; have ALL your important papers in one place to easily take them with you if an evacuation is ordered. Review and become familiar with your evacuation route. Keep your vehicle's gas tank full. In short, remember what Boy Scouts have been taught to do, "Be Prepared"! By being prepared you can prevent panic and confusion by making sure you know where to go and what to do in an emergency.

I would like to leave you with this final thought: "If you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there".

deed restrictions to be enacted and enforced. Special thanks go to Karin Anderson, who shepherded this project. She notes that we received more than 70% return in both Phase 1 and Phase 2. This is extremely important to Holiday Park in that without this authorization, our deed restrictions would have been impossible to enforce, and soon our community could have become a "trailer park". Thanks to all who worked on this project and agreed to continue our "deed restricted community" designation.

In other good news, our legal counsel has advised us that the bill which we sponsored in the State Legislature to remove the ambiguity as to whether the Board of Trustees had the authority to enforce rules and regulations – has passed and been signed into law by Governor DeSantis. As you may remember, a court ruled that a sister Park in Sarasota had the authority to make rules, but not enforce those rules. Makes absolutely no sense, but sometimes that happens. That Park had the same language in its founding documents as do we. Not that the question has been cleared up, we may continue to keep Holiday Park the great community that it is without a potential legal cloud.

At its May meeting, the Board agreed to spend up to \$80,000 to remodel the exterior of the administration building during this summer. We have more than \$200,000 in reserved funds for building renovation, so our budget will not be impacted.

In Covid-19 news, you may be aware that the Board and management set rules regarding assembly and use of facilities based upon the rules and recommendations established by the Florida Department of Health. As of this writing, the FDH recommends that in communities of age 65+, assemblies be limited to ten or fewer people. The limit is to control the spread of the virus throughout a vulnerable population, into which category most residents of Holiday Park fall. The Board of Trustees has a legal obligation to enforce those rules. The rules were established to protect resident's health and lives. Should only one resident become infected, that resident could pass the virus on to too many others, and those to many others, etc. It is a chain reaction of sickness - and possibly death.

It seems as if some residents believe they are immune, and a gathering of 25 or 30 is OK if it's for some good reason, like a music bash or a birthday celebration. Some look for "loop-holes" in the rules, such as "We're not a group, just a bunch of individuals" or "We won't be here long". Such attitudes can only serve to put our residents at an unnecessary risk.

The Trustees are charged by law with enforcing the regulations of the State of Florida, but we are not a police force, nor do we want to be. We can't forcibly disperse a violating crowd or eject those who violate pool rules. We must rely upon the good intentions and common sense of our residents. All we can do is to remind those who openly violate those rules of the unnecessary risk they put themselves and others in.

Park management and Trustees truly desire to open the Park facilities as soon as we safely can. You may not fully agree with the rules established for our residents, but you must follow them. Trustees and the Park Manager communicate frequently, while keeping updated with state, county, and local regulations, and what is happening in our sister communities along the gulf coast. The virus is still out there, and it still kills many people in Florida each day. Until the day it is conquered, the Trustees ask that residents follow the guidelines and rules exactly and not second-guess the health experts or the Trustees.

As long as there are only 5 other people at the pool, you may look for me at the deep end again!

FYI

Water Line Construction--North Port Utilities has notified us that they will be working in Holiday Park throughout the summer months replacing lateral water pipes, that is the pipe which runs from the water main to the water meter in front of your coach. These old galvanized pipes are beyond their life expectancy and have been breaking throughout the Park. New water meters are also being installed. Each home may be out of water for about 20 minutes while the connection is made. There is no additional cost to Holiday Park or homeowners for this replacement.

HURRICANE INFO

To all residents that are medically-dependent residing in Holiday Park during hurricane season. Please contact Sarasota County and apply NOW for registration as a medically-dependent person (MDP). Examples are use of oxygen or medical equipment that requires electricity. It is important to apply in advance for this program so, if qualified, you will be on the county's registry for transportation and sheltering at a medically-dependent Evacuation Center during a disaster. Pre-

registration is required. To apply or for more information visit scgov.net and search for medical needs or call 941-861-5000.

June 1st - Nov. 30th is HURRICANE SEASON... Are you ready?

We are all aware that the Hurricane Season began on June 1st and will run through November 30th. Since we all reside in a mobile home, we need to be extra vigilant when a hurricane is fast approaching. There are several things to keep in mind.

Mobile Home residents should NEVER stay inside a mobile home to ride out a hurricane. Mobile home residents MUST evacuate for any hurricane order given in the county, regardless of location within the county.

At-Home Healthcare & Home bound Patients should tell their home health agency and oxygen company where they will be during a hurricane. Ask them about their plans to provide care. If you are home bound, but not under the care of a home health agency, contact your physician to determine your best plan of action.

If you do evacuate, remember to take your medications, written instructions regarding your care, any special equipment you will require as well as your bedding with you.

If you will need assistance in an evacuation or need to go to a special needs/medically dependent shelter/evacuation center, please register with Sarasota County's emergency management agency now.

These are but a few of the steps you should take to keep you and yours safe during a hurricane. For more specific information check with Holiday Parks office to see if they have any more All-Hazards Disaster Planning Guide, The official guide for Sarasota County. Are you ready? BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS CARS. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST RIDE ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ALL TIMES. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

Fish is a volunteer organization that can drive North Port Residents to physician appts., to get your medications, or to go shopping for groceries. They cannot take anyone with a wheelchair.

You are only allowed one ride a week so you must plan accordingly. You must call 941-474-8802 the day before between 8 AM and 3 PM. They charge \$5 for a ride round-trip to a North Port location.

They charge \$10 for a ride round-trip to Port Charlotte, Venice, or Englewood.

Tuesday- they drive individuals to Walmart.

Thursday- they drive individuals to Publix, Winn Dixie, and Aldi's

Please remember if you do grocery shopping, that counts as your once weekly trip. So, plan accordingly.
