

We are sending violation notices to homeowners regarding the absence of a carport. Please adhere to the rules and regulations. If I contact you or send a letter, website: ACC Rule # 13

is also affixed thereto a carport, a minimum of sixteen (16) feet in length by eleven (11) feet wide in the clear. a. No coach, or structure, may be placed or erected on any lot closer than six (6) feet from the property line on the sides, ten (10) feet from the property line at the rear and ten (10) feet from the property line abutting the road. All measurements shall be from the base of the unit. b. The front setback shall conform to the setback line established by adjoining units. c. All siding used for coaches or other structures must be approved by the ACC. d. Supports required for carports, or other structures, such as porches & sheds, should be constructed with aluminum, steel, or other approved material. Wood must be encased in either aluminum, vinyl siding, PVC sleeve, or painted to match the coach or painted white.


