Dear Holiday Park Residents,

As summer begins, I hope you are enjoying the beautiful weather and taking time to stay safe, cool, and hydrated. It has been a pleasure meeting so many residents this season and attending the many outstanding events that make Holiday Park such a special community.

As hurricane season approaches, please take time to prepare early. Hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30, and residents are encouraged to know your evacuation zone, review emergency supplies, and make sure you have reliable ways to receive weather alerts. Please secure and/or remove any loose objects around your property that could become airborne during high winds and create unsafe conditions. Outdoor furniture, decorations, potted plants, tools, and other unsecured items can become dangerous projectiles during severe weather events. Your cooperation helps protect neighboring homes, vehicles, and community property during hurricane season.

As another successful season comes to a close, I sincerely thank the Board of Trustees, committee members, staff, volunteers, and residents for your continued support, cooperation, and dedication to our community. I especially want to recognize the Trustees, committee members, and volunteers who give so generously of their time to serve Holiday Park. Your efforts are deeply appreciated.

The new pavilion permitting process is underway, and we appreciate the continued support and generous donations for this project. Residents can still help maximize their impact—double in fact with \$25,000 in matching funds remaining. Donations may be dropped off or mailed to the District Office.

IMPORTANT GOLF CART INFORMATION

FLORIDA LAW - Effective October 1, 2023

Golf cart drivers under the age of 18 must be at least 15 with a learner’s permit or 16 with a driver’s license. Anyone who is 18 or older needs a valid government issued ID.

This change in the law is due to the number of children injured and killed while driving golf carts. Please keep your grandchildren safe and do not allow them to drive your golf cart.

2026/2027 PICNICS & PARKING

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard court, please park alongside the courts. DO NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks between the parking lot, the shuffleboard court, and the kitchen. Golf cart parking is also available in the designated spaces of the parking lots in front of, and on the side of the club house. This gives the workers room to get from the charcoal grill to the serving tables and to the beverage area. Please do not park in spaces obviously designated for cars. The entry ways

will be the same as always—on both sides of the big tree. **PLEASE DO NOT ENTER** area marked with caution tape. Please abide by the **NO PARKING** lines. This is important so that there is always access for emergency vehicles if they are needed. It's important to remember that all residential lots of Holiday Park are private property and require permission from the owners if you want to walk across or park on their property.

Greetings Neighbors!

We are now in the summer lawn care season which means that the lawn care crews will be here every Friday (weather permitting).

The following are a few reminders - Please remove items from your lawn on scheduled lawn care days (cars, hoses, chairs, toys...). The lawn care provider is not responsible for damage to wires, cable, pipes, and other items that are protruding from the ground that are not clearly marked and/or protected.

All hard surfaces (roadways, driveways, walkways, concrete curbs) shall be edged in concurrence with each mowing. Edging around landscaping, homes, sheds, and decorative items is not part of our current contract.

Remember if you have any property damage as a result of our lawn care practices – please, contact the office with the date, time, how the damage occurs, by whom, and estimated cost to fix the damage.

Let's all work together to keep our beautiful community thriving!!

SAFETY

We have many new residents in the Park, please everyone remember that you must wear your name badge whenever you're out and about. There are many people out walking around the Park without a name badge or visitors tag and this makes residents nervous because they don't know who you are. Please remember that Park ID Badges must be worn by all residents, including owners, non-resident owners, renters and any guests visiting Holiday Park while using all Park facilities and common areas.

I've noticed that several homes don't have any house numbers or the number don't meet the Holiday Park requirements. This is covered in ACC Rule #24: Numbers must be attached to the front of your home in a visible area, and the numbers must be four (4) to six (6) inches high. It is very important that everyone has their street address numbers displayed on the front of their home for emergency purposes. You want the NP Fire/Rescue Squad and NPPD to be able to find your home quickly.

Please remember to follow the posted speed limit of 15 mph for everyone's safety! Also, please remember to stop at all STOP signs. These rules of the road apply to all golf carts, bicycles and E-bikes, too. The E-bikes have the ability to go much faster than the pedal bikes. I've also seen bicycles riding two abreast, this is also a safety concern. I would hate to see anyone have an accident or someone get hurt. Let's all please follow the posted speed and stop signs. As always, if there is any suspicious activity in the park, please contact North Port PD. Call 911 for emergency assistance or for nonemergency issues, call them at (941)429-7300.
