Of course, foremost on everyone's mind is the effect of coronavirus on the health and lives of our loved ones and ourselves. The Board of Trustees closed all activities and venues in the Park effective the afternoon of March 13th. We did so after consulting advice from the federal website on Covid-19, the State of Florida, our survey of what was happening in other similar 55+ communities in the area - and conferring with our legal counsel. One thing we know about this bug is that it is particularly severe on elderly, and the death rate is up to 4 times more than for the young. We apologize for shortening the season, but we would rather be criticized for being too cautious (as a few have done), than be admonished for not acting in a timely manner, resulting in serious illness, or worse, for any of our residents.

Watch the electronic sign for updates. Please do not call the office for updates on what is open or closed. Should you need to come to the office, please observe the "safe zone" which helps to keep our office staff from direct contact with residents. We have blocked off a two-foot area in front of the windows so that residents may talk to the office staff without leaning on the counter or talking through the windows. Your cooperation will go a long way toward keeping this bug from spreading in Holiday Park.

Trustee meetings will continue as necessary with the appropriate notice and public access. Check the electronic sign for times and place of meetings, which may not follow the published schedule and may be held at a site other than the main Ph 1 hall.

Information exists elsewhere in this newsletter on receiving refunds for cancelled sports and recreation events in the Park.

Both laundries are open for access to machines and water. We may postpone remodeling of the Phase 1 laundry until this scourge blows over, but we'll revisit this issue weekly.

It's great being part of a caring community like Holiday Park, where neighbors look out for each other. That caring doesn't always exist in other gated communities. Watch out for your neighbors, especially those living alone. If you haven't seen them or heard from them in a while, please call them to ensure that they're healthy. Don't hesitate to call 911 if you suspect that someone is home alone and unable to communicate.

Thanks to all our residents for their great cooperation during this stressful time. And to our neighbors who are heading north, have a safe trip and return to us healthy in the fall. Since the pool is closed, don't look for me at the deep end! I ain't there.

General Information on Holiday Park Trustees and Meetings

Holiday Park, Park and Recreation District has a board of 9 Trustees who oversee the operation of Holiday Park. They each serve a two-year term. One year there are 4 Trustees up for reelection and the next year there are 5 Trustees up for reelection. As a Special District, our election is held through Sarasota County and Trustees are duly elected by qualified voters of the district. If an existing Trustee has no one running against them, and they wish to remain in office, they are seated without an election. Holiday Park homeowners who are Florida residents and meet the county qualifications are eligible to run for a Trustee position. They must choose to run for one of the 9 Trustee seats. They must specify with Sarasota County the seat to which they wish to be elected.

The Trustees need to be knowledgeable on House Bill 1855, the Deed Restrictions, the Sunshine law, the general park rules and regulations and legal liabilities that apply to them, etc. Holiday Park, Park and Recreation District has Trustee By-laws, etc. which define the Duties of the Trustees.

After the Trustee election is complete, an organizational meeting is held at which the Trustees elect officers; these are the Chairperson, 1st Vice Chairperson, 2nd Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and Secretary. After this meeting, an assignment meeting is held at which the Chairperson gives each Trustee his/her area of responsibility. These areas of responsibility are

(1) Personnel,
(2) Maintenance Roads & Grounds, (3) Compounds, (4) Rules & Regulations, (5) Architectural, (6) Operations, (7) Liaison for the HOA, (8) Security, and (9) Lawn Maintenance & Drainage.

A Park Manager is hired by the Board of Trustees to conduct the day-to-day operations of the Park. The Park Manager reports to the Board of Trustees.

The Holiday Park homeowners are encouraged to attend Trustee meetings. There are two Trustee meetings each month (mainly during the season). One Trustee meeting is a Workshop and the second meeting is called a regular meeting. Before each meeting an agenda is posted and placed on our website. The meeting dates are published yearly and a listing of the meeting scheduled dates and times can be picked up at the Holiday Park Office. If a special meeting needs to be held, it will be publicized for our residents' knowledge and must meet the meeting notice requirements.

Because of the Florida Sunshine Law, the Trustees can only discuss agenda items and park issues with other Trustees at open meetings.

Therefore, the agenda items for the Workshop are discussed by the Trustees for the first time at the open Workshop meetings. Homeowners can comment on any agenda items at this time. Resident comments are limited to three minutes throughout the meeting. Then the Trustees discuss the agenda item and open it up for comments from the residents for that agenda item. The Trustees appreciate receiving resident comments on each agenda item after they (Trustees) have finished discussing the item. They do not vote on the agenda items at this Workshop but can table the agenda item, or forward the agenda item to the regular meeting where they will vote on that item. At the end of the meeting it is open to Trustees to make additional comments and then to residents to make additional comments.

At the regular meeting, homeowners can comment on any

agenda items. Then, each agenda item is open for Trustee comments, followed by resident comments. Again, each resident's comments on the agenda item is limited to three minutes throughout the meeting. The Trustees appreciate resident comments on each agenda item after they (Trustees) have finished discussing the item. The Trustees then vote on that agenda item. At the end of the meeting it is open to Trustees to make additional comments and then for residents to make additional comments.

REVISED GATE ACCESS PROCEDURES

All residents have two codes, one for your own personal access, and one for access by your visitors or contractors. Your personal access code should not be given out to others; it is for your own use.

When entering the front gate, if you have a barcode on your vehicle, you may go past the barcode reader in the resident lane as always. Or, enter the call box lane (Visitor Entrance) and punch in your 4-digit personal code with # in front of it. Example: #1234

For guests or contractors to whom you have given the 3-digit guest code, they must enter "0" (zero) and the 3-digit code at the call box. Example: 0123 This will ring your phone number which you have registered with the office. When you answer the call, you can speak to the visitor and decide whether you wish to grant access. If you do want to grant access, press 9 on your phone and hold it until the call is disconnected. The gate will open. Using transponders (proximity cards) and barcodes at the front and rear gates has not changed. If you do not know your 3-digit guest code, please contact the office for yours.

DEED RESTRICTIONS FILED AND RECORDED

Holiday Park, Park & Recreation District are providing notice to our homeowners that our two recently filed and recorded deed restriction amendments are available on our Holiday Park website, holidayparknp.com. Homeowners can also come to the office for copies or request copies be sent to them.

These amendments have been added to our full deed restriction documents, which are also available on our website. This notice will also be published in the Holiday Park Newsletter, announced at a Trustee meeting, at a Homeowners Association meeting, and posted on the Phase I and Phase II Trustee bulletin boards.

These deed restrictions are now enforceable.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS CARS. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST RIDE ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ALL TIMES. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

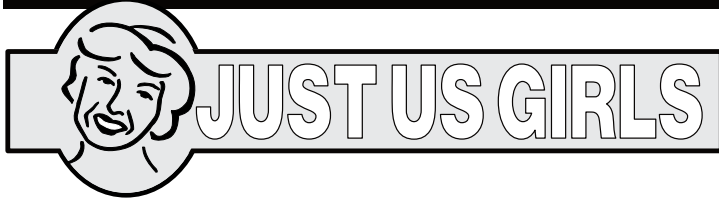

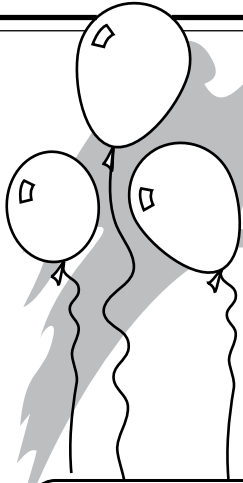

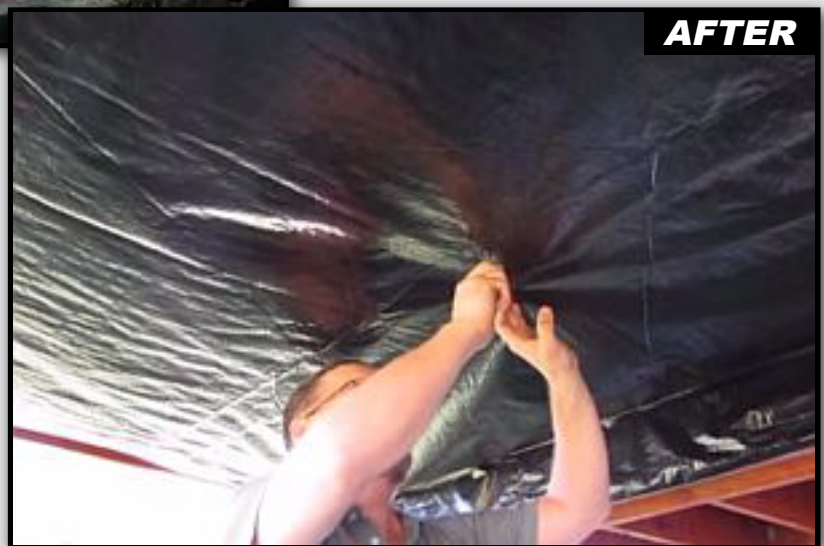
