GREETINGS FROM THE DISTRICT MANAGER



Dear Holiday Park Residents,

As we welcome September, I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable summer. While the summer months may be a quieter time in our community, there

has been plenty happening behind the scenes as we continue working on improvements, projects, and planning for the upcoming season.

Our **Maintenance Staff, Tanner and Nick, and Groundskeeper, Dave**, have been very busy throughout the summer months. Their work has included new landscaping throughout our common areas, replacing/repairing mailbox posts throughout the community, cleaning and repairing the Memorial Walkway Bridge, and addressing many other maintenance and improvement projects.

During the month of September, our **Custodians, Don and Mark**, will be performing deep cleaning services in the phase 1 and two buildings.

Our **Office Staff, Madison, Aggie, and Erika**, have also been working diligently behind the scenes. They have been organizing electronic and physical documents, working on records retention and organization, updating office procedures, and preparing the office and administrative operations for the upcoming season. Although much of this work may not be visible to our residents, it is an important part of keeping the District organized, efficient, and prepared to serve our community.

I would also like to take this opportunity to **welcome our new Administrative Assistant, Aggie Aguila, to the Holiday Park team!** Aggie is a much-welcomed addition to our office, and we are excited to have her as part of our team. If you haven't had the opportunity to meet her yet, please stop by the office and introduce yourself when you have a chance. I know you will join me in making her feel welcome here at Holiday Park!

I truly appreciate the hard work and dedication of the staff throughout the summer.

I am pleased to share that **the new pool furniture has now been installed at both the Phase 1 and Phase 2 pools**, and it looks beautiful! The new furniture provides a fresh, updated appearance for both pool areas and offers

our residents and guests a more comfortable place to relax and enjoy the amenities. We hope everyone enjoys this improvement for many years to come.

The **Pavilion and Men's Club Storage Building projects** continue to move forward. We have experienced some delays with the permitting process, which is not unexpected with projects of this nature. We continue to work closely with the City of North Port to address the remaining permitting requirements and keep the projects moving forward. Despite the permitting delays, we remain on track to have both the Pavilion and Men's Club Storage Building installed as planned. We appreciate everyone's patience as we work through this important process.

Our **Stormwater Drainage Catch Basin Improvement project** also continues to move forward. Summit Excavating has completed the approved Phase 1 locations and work on the approved Phase 2 locations began in August. These improvements are an important investment in Holiday Park and are intended to improve drainage, reduce standing water, and provide long-term benefits to our community. Once this phase of the drainpipe installation is completed this month, the affected areas will be repaved to restore the roadways.

I would also like to thank our residents for their continued cooperation with **property inspections and compliance with the Deed Restrictions and ACC Rules and Regulations**. Please remember during the rainy season to be on the lookout for weeds growing faster and mold/mildew showing on your home. If you have received a violation notice, please remember that correcting the issue or communicating with the District Manager regarding your plan to address it helps us work toward resolving the matter.

ACC Rules and Regulations (Rule #1): The Homeowner is responsible for submitting an application to the ACC for improvements and all work done on the outside of the house. Permits are to be returned to the Park office upon completion. Permits will not be issued if the homeowner has any outstanding violations of the ACC Rules and Regulations which have not yet been corrected.

With hurricane season continuing through November 30, please remain weather aware and prepared. Review your emergency plans and make sure outdoor furniture, decorations, and other loose items can be secured quickly

when severe weather is approaching.

As we approach the fall season, we are preparing for the return of more residents and the increased activity throughout the Park. Our staff has been working hard to make sure Holiday Park is ready for the upcoming season, and we look forward to welcoming everyone back.

Thank you for your continued patience, cooperation, and support as we work to improve Holiday Park. I look forward to a busy and productive fall season and to seeing many of you back in the Park.

IMPORTANT 911 INFORMATION

When calling 911 tell dispatchers that you live in North Port. Calls go into Charlotte County, so it helps them to know your exact location and saves valuable time.

PAVILION COMMITTEE UPDATE

Creek Engineering conducted the environmental survey on July 17, 2026, as required by the City of North Port for permitting the Pavilion. Their scope of work included the following:

1. **Gopher Tortoise Survey** — completed
2. **Protected/Endangered Species Reporting** — completed
3. **FLUCCS (Florida Land Cover Classification System)** mapping of the parcel and vegetation areas — completed

We are currently waiting for schedule confirmation from the engineering company that will perform the Stormwater/ Drainage Survey. We will provide an update once the schedule is confirmed. As you can see, this is a multi-step process, and each step must be completed before we can proceed to the next stage.

All required plans, engineering documents, elevations, and supporting documentation for the Pavilion have been completed and submitted to the City of North Port. The project is currently moving through the City's Development Review Committee (DRC) process. Once the DRC staff review is

completed and any outstanding City requirements are satisfied, the Site Development Plan Amendment can be approved and the Development Order issued.

It is important to note that the DRC staff review and subsequent Development Order are separate from the planning and zoning review that occurs later as part of the building permit process. Each step must be completed before construction can proceed.

The Park office is currently waiting for additional information from the City regarding a possible timeframe for completion of the permitting process. While there have been some delays, everything is continuing to move forward as quickly as possible.

2026/2027 PICNICS & PARKING

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard court, please park alongside the courts.

DO NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks

between the parking lot, the shuffleboard court, and the kitchen. Golf cart parking is also available in the designated spaces of the parking lots in front of, and on the side of the club house. This gives the workers room to get from the charcoal grill to the serving tables and to the beverage area. Please do not park in spaces obviously designated for cars. The entry ways will be the same as always—on both sides of the big tree. PLEASE DO NOT ENTER area marked with caution tape. Please abide by the NO PARKING lines. This is important so that there is always access for emergency vehicles if they are needed. It's important to remember that all residential lots of Holiday Park are private property and require permission from the owners if you want to walk across or park on their property.

SAFETY

I hope that everyone is having a good summer. Please remember to stay hydrated and avoid outdoor activities during the hottest time of the day.



Please everyone, remember that you must wear your name badge whenever you're out and about. Park ID Badges must be worn by all residents, including owners, non-resident owners, renters and any guests visiting Holiday Park while using all Park facilities and while in any common areas.

We had a recent incident where a resident was not wearing their name badge and had no other identification on them.

They were injured while on an e-bike and unconscious, NPPD had to come and identify

them. This is an example of why name badges are so important. I hear so often from residents, "I don't need to wear it because everyone knows me.," but that is not true.

We have many new residents here and everyone doesn't know each other. Please wear your name badges.

Bicyclists, remember, NO bicycles of any type (including e-bikes) can use the vehicle gates. You must use the pedestrian gate. We don't want to see residents being struck by the bar.

Please make sure your home has the proper house numbers. This is covered in ACC rule no. 24: Street Address Numbers conforming to city requirements must be attached to the front of the coach in a visible area. Numbers must be a minimum of four (4) inches high and no larger than twelve (12) inches high. The four inch minimum is a city requirement. This will help NP Fire/Rescue locate your residence during an emergency.

Please remember to follow the posted speed limit of 15 mph for everyone's safety! I would hate to see anyone have an accident or someone get hurt. Let's all keep our speed at 15 mph or less!

As always, if there is any suspicious activity in the park, please contact North Port PD. Call 911 for emergency assistance or for nonemergency issues, call them at (941)429-7300.

issued ID.

injured and killed while driving golf carts. Please keep

your golf cart.



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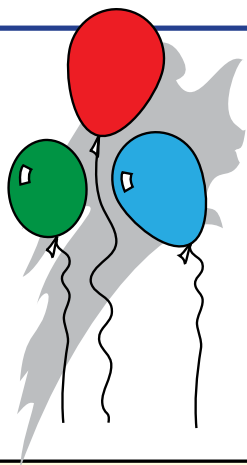

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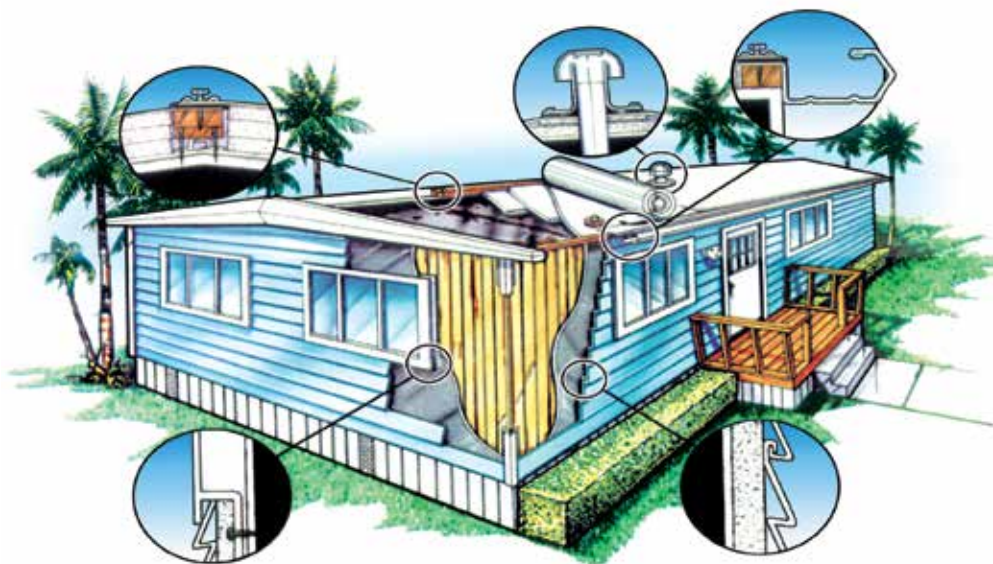
