Just keep in mind, you may be gone, but you won't be forgotten! I anticipate that from time to time whomever your replacement is will be seeking your advice. Centennial Bank, the bank that the HOA, and other organizations in Holiday Park, does business with, has offered to provide the buns, hot dogs, chips, cookies, water and condiments (and the grill and cooks). Due to the need to restock the food pantry, the HOA Council has decided to charge \$5/person. ALL proceeds will benefit the Food Pantry! Tickets will be available in the Phase 2 on Monday & Tuesday, March 2nd & 3rd from 8 to 10 AM. Holiday Park will vote for candidates for the one vacant seat on the Board of Trustees. You may vote early at the Elections office on Biscayne and Rt. 41 during the prior week. Candidates are Kim Branch and Jim Oliver, who will have the opportunity to give a short "campaign speech" at the March 12 regular Trustee meeting. The winner of that contest and returning trustees holding odd numbered seats will be sworn in at the March 19 meeting. Kim and Jim have bios posted in the administration building.

We've had some glitches in updating our gate software, but we hope at this printing that all is well. The entire system was changed, necessitating inputting hundreds of codes. A few were miscoded, resulting in some inconvenience to a few residents. Apologies for any inconvenience which our residents may have suffered but we believe the bugs are now out of the system.

We now have new microphones for meetings in the main hall. These new mics are much more sensitive than the old ones and seem to be a great improvement. We thank the Men's Club and HOA for assisting with the cost of this improvement.

REVISED GATE ACCESS PROCEDURES

All residents have two codes, one for your own personal access, and one for access by your visitors or contractors. Your personal access code should not be given out to others; it is for your own use.

When entering the front gate, if you have a barcode on your vehicle, you may go past the barcode reader in the resident lane as always. Or, enter the call box lane (Visitor Entrance) and punch in your 4-digit personal code with # in front of it. Example: #1234

For guests or contractors to whom you have given the 3-digit guest code, they must enter "0" (zero) and the 3-digit code at the call box. Example: 0123 This will ring your phone number

which you have registered with the office. When you answer the call, you can speak to the visitor and decide whether you wish to grant access. If you do want to grant access, press 9 on your phone and hold it until the call is disconnected. The gate will open. Using transponders (proximity cards) and barcodes at the front and rear gates has not changed. If you do not know your 3-digit guest code, please contact the office for yours.

DEED RESTRICTIONS FILED AND RECORDED

These deed restrictions are now enforceable.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. **GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS CARS. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST RIDE ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ALL TIMES.** A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

PARKING FOR PICNIC'S

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard courts, please park along the side of the courts. DO NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks between the parking lot, the shuffleboard court and the kitchen. Golf cart parking is also available in the designated spaces of the parking lots in front of the club house and on the side of the club house. The change in parking for the picnic is to give the workers room to get from the charcoal cookers to the serving tables and to the beverage area. Please do not park in spaces obviously designated for cars. The entry ways will be the same as always—on both sides of the big tree. Please abide by the NO PARKING lines. Sometimes golf carts, scooters, bikes and cars are parked on these painted lines which mean NO PARKING in this space. This is important so that there is always access for emergency vehicles if they are needed. It's important to remember that all residential lots in Holiday Park are private property and require permission from the owners if you want to walk across their property or park on their property.

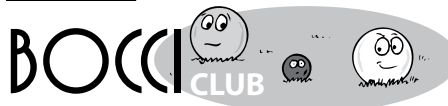

HAND (A Holiday Park Organization)

Helping Hand will drive you to get groceries, to the pharmacy and to your doctor appointment. For individuals who no longer drive, this is a special service for you as well. Remember, they are volunteers who have limited time. Please call 48 hours before you need a ride. This allows individuals to work their schedule around your needs. We will gladly help any residents, but remember we need notice. We also have medical equipment such as walkers, shower chairs, etc., available for our residents to meet your needs. All the Helping Hand phone numbers are in the Holiday Park newsletter.

SOCIAL SERVICES AVAILABLE

The City of North Port is unique in that it has its own Social Services Division. This past year, the division assisted more

than 1,000 people, through financial, rental, utility, and other services. If you, or someone you know, needs a little extra help, consider reaching out. You can reach the division at 941-429-3700. Another option is to stop by the Family Service Center, 6919 Outreach Way, to visit in person. Their kind and accepting staff will be waiting to assist you.

FISH (A North Port Volunteer Organization)

Fish is a volunteer organization that can drive North Port Residents to physician appts., to get your medications, or to go shopping for groceries. They cannot take anyone with a wheelchair. You are only allowed one ride a week so you must plan accordingly. You must call 941-474-8802 the day before between 8 AM and 3 PM. They charge \$5 for a ride round-trip to a North Port location. They charge \$10 for a ride round-trip to Port Charlotte, Venice, or Englewood.

Tuesday- they drive individuals to Walmart.

Thursday- they drive individuals to Publix, Winn Dixie, and Aldi's

Please remember if you do grocery shopping, that counts as your once weekly trip. So, plan accordingly.

GENERAL INFORMATION ON HOLIDAY PARK TRUSTEES AND MEETINGS

Holiday Park, Park and Recreation District has a board of 9 Trustees who oversee the operation of Holiday Park. They each serve a two-year term. One year there are 4 Trustees up for reelection and the next year there are 5 Trustees up for reelection. As a Special District, our election is held through Sarasota County and Trustees are duly elected by qualified voters of the district. If an existing Trustee has no one running against them, and they wish to remain in office, they are seated without an election. Holiday Park homeowners who are Florida residents and meet the county qualifications are eligible to run for a Trustee position. They must choose to run for one of the 9 Trustee seats. They must specify with Sarasota County the seat to which they wish to be elected.

The Trustees need to be knowledgeable on House Bill 1855, the Deed Restrictions, the Sunshine law, the general park rules and regulations and legal liabilities that apply to them, etc. Holiday Park, Park and Recreation District has Trustee By-laws, etc. which define the Duties of the Trustees.

After the Trustee election is complete, an organizational meeting is held at which the Trustees elect officers; these are the Chairperson, 1st Vice Chairperson, 2nd Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and Secretary. After this meeting, an assignment meeting is held at which the Chairperson gives each Trustee his/her area of responsibility. These areas of responsibility are (1) Personnel,

(2) Maintenance Roads & Grounds, (3) Compounds, (4) Rules & Regulations, (5) Architectural, (6) Operations, (7) Liaison for the HOA, (8) Security, and (9) Lawn Maintenance & Drainage.

A Park Manager is hired by the Board of Trustees to conduct the day-to-day operations of the Park. The Park Manager reports to the Board of Trustees.

The Holiday Park homeowners are encouraged to attend Trustee meetings. There are two Trustee meetings each month (mainly during the season). One Trustee meeting is a Workshop and the second meeting is called a regular meeting. Before each meeting an agenda is posted and placed on our website. The meeting dates are published yearly and a listing of the meeting scheduled dates and times can be picked up at the Holiday Park Office. If a special meeting needs to be held, it will be publicized for our residents' knowledge and must meet the meeting notice requirements.

Because of the Florida Sunshine Law, the Trustees can only discuss agenda items and park issues with other Trustees at open meetings.

Therefore, the agenda items for the Workshop are discussed by the Trustees for the first time at the open Workshop meetings. Homeowners can comment on any agenda items at this time. Resident comments are limited to three minutes throughout the meeting. Then the Trustees discuss the agenda item and open it up for comments from the residents for that agenda item. The Trustees appreciate receiving resident comments on each agenda item after they (Trustees) have finished discussing the item. They do not vote on the agenda items at

this Workshop but can table the agenda item, or forward the agenda item to the regular meeting where they will vote on that item. At the end of the meeting it is open to Trustees to make additional comments and then to residents to make additional comments.

At the regular meeting, homeowners can comment on any agenda items. Then, each agenda item is open for Trustee comments, followed by resident comments. Again, each resident's comments on the agenda item is limited to three minutes throughout the meeting. The Trustees appreciate resident comments on each agenda item after they (Trustees) have finished discussing the item. The Trustees then vote on that agenda item. At the end of the meeting it is open to Trustees to make additional comments and then for residents to make additional comments.

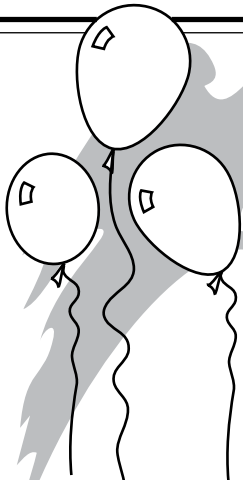

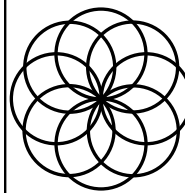

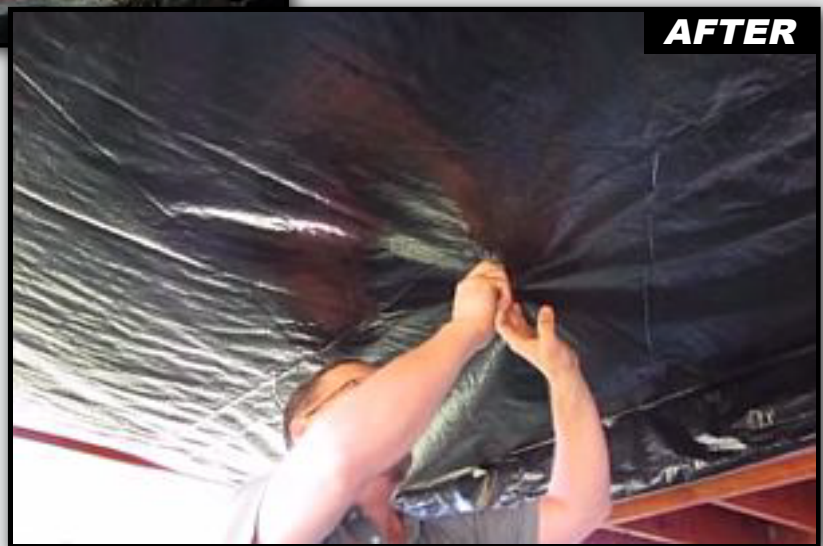
