### TRUSTEE NOTICE

As I'm sure we are all aware, Governor DeSantis has issued Executive order 20-52. This order requires a state-wide "stay at home" order effective Friday, April 3rd at midnight for at least the next 30 days. As such, the Holiday Park Staff will be working on a rotating schedule. The office will be available by phone M-F 10am - 2pm. In-person appointments will be scheduled as needed for businesses that cannot wait until after this emergency. Maintenance staff will perform essential duties also on a rotating schedule.

Our security guards will be at work and understand the importance of their position and will be keeping extra eyes and ears on the community while we all try to get some sleep.

ALL buildings, facilities, and recreational areas will remain closed with the exception of the Phase II laundry. The Phase I laundry is now closed. The food pantry collection box has also been moved to the PH II laundry.

If you have been to the grocery store, Walmart, or the gas station within the last 2 weeks, YOU MAY HAVE BEEN exposed to the Coronavirus. Please obey the 6 feet apart and less than 10 people rules. Please DO NOT play in or on the park's courts, pits, or common ground. Please do not gather in cul-de-sacs or gazebos. Please follow the CDC guidelines (<https://www.cdc.gov/.../.../prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>) on protecting yourself. By doing this we will be protecting EVERYONE in the park.

Feel free to contact me or any other Trustee with any questions or concerns about the current Executive Order or how Holiday Park is dealing with the current dangerous pandemic.

### BOARD OF TRUSTEES

As of this writing, we're in the second month of our social isolation with no real end in sight. In my discussion with our residents (at a distance of at least 6'!) I find that nearly everyone fully understands that keeping our distances, refraining from gathering, not using our recreation facilities and leaving our community only when we must, is helping to keep this scourge from our gates.

Our office has been closed to in-person visits as a protection to our staff and residents and will remain so until the Governor and Department of Health lift the state-wide restrictions. Even when that occurs, as a 55+ community, we must be more vigilant than others. We may be closed a bit longer than recommended, but we'll let circumstances help dictate that decision. Your Board of Trustees takes that responsibility seriously.

Our office and maintenance staff are on reduced schedules, but our night security staff schedule remains unchanged. Office hours are 10 am to 2 pm during this partial shutdown. You may contact the office by phone for any business or concerns.

Park Manager Tess Schofield is on reduced hours, but she is available by phone at all times during regular business hours. She may be reached through the HP office staff, who will relay a message to her. You may also contact any trustee with issues.

The Board of Trustees has agreed to continue full salary and benefits to our staff during this difficult time. Since we derive most of our income from maintenance fees paid by homeowners, our revenue will be little affected. Our budget should see no change as a result of current events. It is fortunate that we, as homeowners, may provide income security to our staff, which does such a great job in helping to keep Holiday Park the great community that it is.

During this crisis, and as protection to refuse workers, the City of North Port has suspended collection of yard waste which is not in approved city containers. The City will not collect yard waste in your own container or bags. Any yard waste you have may be put in the green garbage containers for the duration (With permission, there's no harm in using your snowbird neighbor's green can).

The Board of Trustees will have a meeting to wrap up seasonal work, such as budget, lawn maintenance contract, employee health insurance contract and a few other minor issues. We have moved the meeting up from May 7 to Thursday, April 30. The Workshop meeting will be held at 10 am and the regular meeting at 10:30, or shortly thereafter. The meeting will probably take place at the pool, as it did in March. We will place chairs near the pool with plenty of distance between them. Some will prefer to attend in their golf carts parked at the pool

fence. This seemed to work well in March. Your participation is encouraged.

The Florida sunshine laws have been modified temporarily to permit attendance by Trustees by phone or through virtual meeting sites such as Zoom. You may be assured that we will take care to follow the requirements of the law. Please watch the electronic sign for updates and details.

I'm practicing "social distancing" (that phrase has now entered our lexicon), so - no, I'm not at the deep end. Watch for my golf cart as I take my daily tours of the park and flag me down if you want to talk. Please stay healthy, and if you're going "up north", return to us in great spirits. We'll be waiting for you!

### DEED & RESTRICTIONS

There is currently in process a mailing to all Holiday Park homeowners from The Organizing Committee regarding revitalization of "Unit One" and "Unit Two" (Phase 1 and Phase 2) declarations, in other words, our deed restrictions. The mailing contains a letter in rather formal legal language describing the purpose of the mailing, and the action requested by each homeowner. The anticipated mailing date is May 5, 2020.

Without our deed restrictions it would become difficult to maintain our community standards, and to keep our property values. These deed restrictions contain the recently approved changes you voted on to protect our community.

If you agree to revitalize the current deed restrictions, please read and sign the "Written Consent" form enclosed in the mailing. If your property is co-owned, such as husband and wife, both should sign if possible.

We must have a majority of our homeowners' written consent to maintain our community standards, and to keep our property values.

The completed "Written Consent" form must be returned in the enclosed envelope to Holiday Park by Tuesday, June 9, 2020, either hand delivered or mailed.

You may keep all of the other documents sent to you. The "Written Consent" needs to be returned to the office, or mailed in using the enclosed return envelope which shows your address, lot and block number.

### BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. **GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME RULES AS CARS. GOLF CARTS AND BIKERS MUST RIDE ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE ROAD AT ALL TIMES.** A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

**SPRING CLEANING TIPS**

Did you know that Spring Cleaning can help you live longer?? According to CNN Health, a less cluttered space can help us reduce stress, improve our mood, and give us more energy. These things can inspire us to eat healthier, exercise more, and get more rest. Who knew! Since many of us are spending more



time indoors these days, why not use this time to declutter and clean your home.

**Tip 1:** Make a Cleaning Schedule. Creating a cleaning schedule makes you more likely to stick to your plan. Be realistic when making your schedule so that you don't become unmotivated and exhausted! You may choose to clean room by room, or you may choose to schedule your cleaning based on tasks. Whatever you decide, make a promise to yourself to stay on schedule.

**Tip 2:** Remove Clutter. You may be familiar with Marie Kondo's best-selling book, "The Life-Changing Magic of Tidying Up", which offers the reader a simple question to help determine whether or not an item should stay or go. The question is: "Does this item spark joy?" Simple enough, right? If the answer is yes, you keep the item. If the answer is no, you either toss or donate the item. **HOME EXERCISE ROUTINES**

Adding a fitness routine to your daily schedule is a great way to stay in shape both mentally and physically. Many of us are missing our regularly scheduled fitness activities offered in our communities or at our local gyms, but that doesn't mean you can't stay fit at home! Check out these exercise suggestions below for an effective at-home workout. The number of repetitions and sets of each exercise is up to you. You can customize this routine based on the amount of time you have.

\*\*\* If you're new to an exercise routine, please obtain clearance from your medical doctor before starting a new program

or attempting any of these activities.

**Warm-Up.** First, warm up your body! If you can, go on a brisk 5-10 minute walk around your neighborhood to get your muscles warmed up. Prefer to stay inside? March in place, step side to side, or turn on your favorite tunes and dance around the living room for a few minutes. After heating up your muscles, dedicate some time to your joints. Think about starting at the top of your body and working your way down. Move your head left and right and tilt your head side to side to warm up your neck. Raise your shoulders up and down, then add some shoulder circles. Roll your shoulders forward for 30 seconds or so then reverse the motion rolling your shoulders back maintaining the circular pattern. Holding your arms out directly in front of you (you may choose to sit in a chair), do some wrist circles in one direction and then reverse the motion. Next, stand with your legs hip width apart, slowly making a figure 8 shape with your hips. Continue in one direction for about 30 seconds and then reverse. Have a seat in a chair and lift one foot off the ground and begin making circles with your ankle. Start in one direction, then reverse the motion. Repeat with the other ankle. Whatever warm-up you prefer, the goal is to warm your muscles and joints to prepare your body for exercise.

**Chair Squats.** If you have knee issues, you may choose to skip this exercise (please consult with your doctor). Squats are a great way to strengthen your lower body. If you can, find two chairs to use for this exercise. One chair will be used for squatting, and the other chair will be used for balance. Place the chairs one behind the other facing the same direction leaving enough room for you to stand between the two chairs. Place your hands on the chair in front of you for balance, then slowly push your hips back, bend your knees, and lower your body to the chair. You may choose to lightly sit on the chair or barely touch it before standing up and returning to the starting position.

**Wall Push Ups.** Wall push ups are a great way to strengthen your upper body. Stand about two feet behind a wall and place your hands on the wall about shoulder height. Begin to bend your elbows out to the sides as you bring your face and chest close to the wall. Your heels will most likely come off the floor - that's ok! Press your hands into the wall to straighten your elbows and return to the starting position.

**Toe Stands.** Grab one of the chairs you used for the squatting exercise and stand directly behind it using the chair for balance. Slowly raise up onto your tiptoes then slowly lower your heels back to the floor.

**Knee Extensions.** Using the same chair, have a seat keeping your back straight and knees bent. One leg at a time, slowly extend your leg out in front of you. Hold this position for a few seconds and then lower back to the starting position. Repeat with opposite leg.

**Chest Expansions.** While still sitting in your chair. Bring your arms straight out in front of you (shoulder height) and place your palms together. As you inhale, open your arms wide extending your fingertips in opposite directions. As you exhale, bring your arms back to the starting position. Continue moving in these motions along with your breath.

**Relax.** At the end of your routine, you may choose to stay sitting in your chair for a little relaxation time. You're encouraged to maintain proper posture and place your hands in your lap. If you'd like, close your eyes and take a few deep breaths. Imagine your favorite person, place, or thing; think about anything that brings you joy and gratitude. With a smile on your face, slowly blink your eyes open, take one last deep breath, and celebrate the positive work you just completed for your body and mind!

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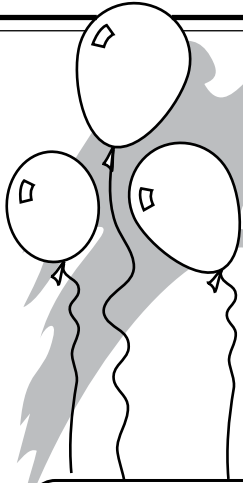

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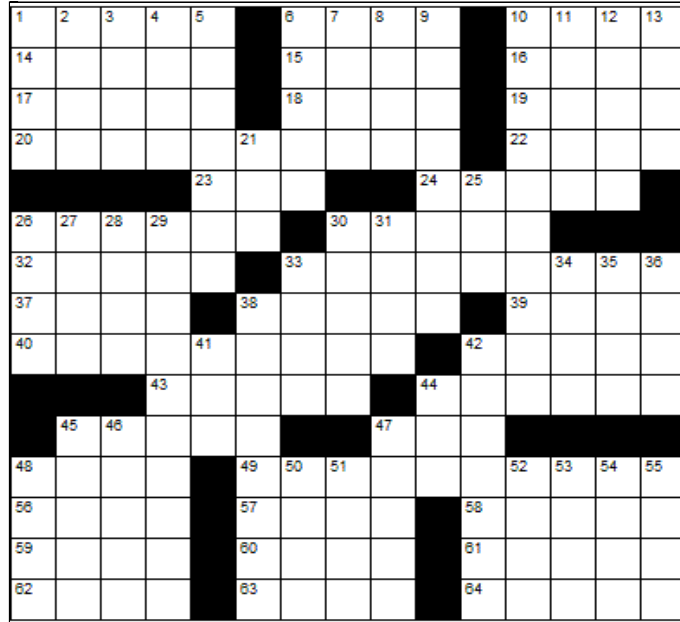

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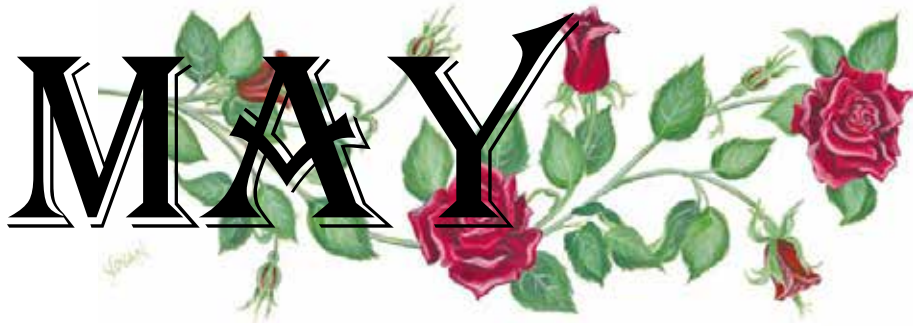
