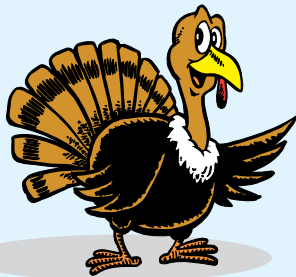

The deed restriction vote by HP homeowners is well underway. If you have

ately. If for some reason you did not receive a ballot and believe you should have, please check in with the office. If you are entitled to vote, you may receive a ballot and vote at the office. All ballots must be received by 3 pm, Monday, November 4th. Any received after that time will not be counted. Ballots will be counted in the main hall on Tuesday, November 5th. You may observe the ballot count, but no noise or talking will be permitted to ensure that those residents appointed to the Election Committee may count ballots accurately, are not disturbed in this important task. The Board of Trustees will act to accept the vote count at its regular meeting on November 7th at 7 pm.

The City of North Port is undertaking a noisy and messy project in our Holiday Park community. From mid-October until mid-December, they will be cleaning sanitary sewers in the Park, starting in Phase 2. This entails using a sewer-jet which pumps water under pressure through the mains. The equipment makes considerable noise, and crews will begin work at 7:30 am each day. The crews will muster at the work site at 7 am for planning the day's work. Besides the noise and inconvenience of having equipment in our streets for months, the city tells us that some may find some dirty water gurgling up in their toilets. We hope this is an infrequent event. After cleaning, the City will televise the sewers to locate cracks and leaks so that defective sections may be lined or replaced. Our infrastructure is now 50 years old and showing its age and needs attention. Happily, the City of North Port will foot the bill for this, with money from water and sewer bills you pay. You may have noticed frequent water line breaks – another symptom of aging which I assume they will fix at a later date.

A sincere welcome to those returning from the frozen north. We've tried to keep Holiday Park clean and neat for your arrival. Our super Park maintenance staff has finished the remodel of the Phase 2 building, and we think they did a super job. Give them a shout-out when you see them around. If you want to talk, you can find me at the deep end of the pool.

BICYCLE REGULATIONS

Note for residents in Holiday Park. Two items from the 55 Alive Driving Class that are especially pertinent in Holiday Park. Golf carts and bikers must follow the same rules as cars. Golf carts and Bikers must ride on the right side of the road at all times. A 3-foot clearance between each vehicle. Also, all cars going by or around bikers must leave a 3-foot clearance. Please keep this in mind when traveling in Holiday Park. A simple test in your own driveway, is to layout something the height of a biker or vehicle and sit behind the wheel of your car.

PARKING FOR PICNIC'S

If you come by golf cart, please park all the way back behind the trees where people have their tables and chairs set up. If you have set your table and chairs near the shuffleboard courts, please park along the side of the courts. DO NOT drive golf carts on the pavers in the sidewalks between the parking lot, the shuffleboard court and the kitchen. Golf cart parking is also available in the designated spaces of the parking lots in front of the club house and on the side of the club house. The change in parking for the picnic is to give the workers room to get from the charcoal cookers to the serving tables and to the beverage area.

Please do not park in spaces obviously designated for cars. The entry ways will be the same as always—on both sides of the big tree. Please abide by the NO PARKING lines. Sometimes golf carts, scooters, bikes and cars are parked on these painted lines which mean NO PARKING in this space. This is important so that there is always access for emergency vehicles if they are needed. It's important to remember that all residential lots in Holiday Park are private property and require permission from the owners if you want to walk across their property or park on their property.

3. Submitted photographs **MUST** be the work of the individual submitting the photograph(s) and **NOT** from other sources, i.e. the internet or other photographers. **EXCEPTION:** IF the HP Computer Club decides to print photographs for the participants, as was done in the 2019 Contest, this will be the **ONLY EXCEPTION.**

4. This year there will be two (2) classifications for photographers:

A. Beginners: A "Beginner" is an individual that has **NEVER** participated in a Photo Contest or won a prize for a photograph that they took.

B. Advanced: An individual that has, at one time or another, participated in a Photo Contest and was awarded a prize, regardless of the significance of the recognition. A recognition of some type was awarded places the participant in the Advanced Classification.
